Police are seeking assistance from the public to help find a missing female and reunite her with family.



### **3 May, from RYDA Road Safety**

This year's #YellowRibbon National Road Safety Week is putting a bright spotlight on vulnerable road users. Today we want you to think about how you drive around pedestrians and how you feel when cars get too close when you're walking. Did you know that the risk of pedestrian death rises exponentially with collision speeds beyond 30 km/h. It is estimated that less than 10% of pedestrians would die when struck by a vehicle travelling at 30 km/h, compared with fatality rates of 26% at 40 km/h and over 80% at 50 km/h. Dropping your speed gives you more time to react, reduces your braking distance and dramatically reduces injury if a collision were to occur.

**2 May, from NSW Police Force [Edited]**



Homicide Squad detectives are appealing for public assistance with an investigation into the death of a woman whose body was found on Sydney's Lower North Shore at the weekend.

Kayakers alerted emergency services after locating the body in the Lane Cove River near Angelo Street, Woolwich, about 10.15am on Sunday (29 April 2018).

While the woman has yet to be formally identified, she is believed to be 38-year-old Brazilian National, Cecilia Haddad.

Ms Haddad worked for a mining company in Western Australia before moving to NSW in 2016 to work as a logistics manager for a freight company, and was most recently living in an apartment on St Annes Street, Ryde.

Detectives from the State Crime Command's Homicide Squad and Ryde Police Area Command have established Strike Force Bronwyn to investigate the circumstances surrounding her death.

A huge thank you to **Det Snr Cst Wendy Burgess**, NSWPF Fraud & Cyber Crime Squad who spoke on Identity Crime. Wendy gave a talk on the problems of identity theft, how it can occur & what practical steps could be taken to avoid having one's identity stolen. Wendy shared the government publications: **Protect Yourself Online, Protecting Your Identity and The Little Black Book of Scams**. NHW have also compiled locally, **Our 20 Favourite Crime Prevention Tips to Protect Your Identity**.

We are always grateful to our Crime Prevention Officer, Ku-ring-gai Police Area Command, Snr Cst Paul Cleary, for his support: Whilst crime in the command was one of the lowest in the state, it did still occur. The biggest problem currently was theft from motor vehicles. People were still leaving valuable items in full view in cars. Thieves have no qualms about breaking a window to get at items, causing repairs that may be more costly than the items stolen. In particular, thieves are targeting car parks.

Bruce and Wal shared news from Ku-ring-gai & Hornsby NHW groups, where volunteers across the areas work together as a team. Gordon Neighbourhood Watch bank account has been used to receive \$690 community funding from NHW Australasia for the **WatchOut!** project. Expenses of \$439.74 were paid to Julia Eagles and \$150.00 to Jess Benhar (logo design). Bank account balance at 15/11/17 confirmed as \$5311.27.

**CURRENT WARNINGS:** Lock your car and remove valuables from view. Please be aware of Identity Theft & fraud (on the increase!). From 'Our 20 Favourite Crime Prevention Tips to Protect Your Identity':

**Tip#1.** Consider using a third party payment system for internet transactions, such as PayPal, in order to avoid entering credit card details. Consider having another credit card with a low credit limit to be used specifically for internet purchases, or for overseas.

**Tip#2.** Use a phantom date of birth when you subscribe or register online. It may be a compulsory field, however, it is NOT legally required. For example use 01/01/ followed by your year of birth - to keep your age demographic intact, but your identity safe.

**Tip#6.** Be aware of wi-fi security, especially items such as baby monitors. Ensure you set a new secure password on all items, especially wi-fi devices, internet router, computer, laptops, tablets, mobile phones, telephone answering-machine, smart TV - look around your home - also known as the 'Internet of Things' (IoT).

**Tip#8.** Shred any unneeded document (statements, accounts) that has your personal details (eg signature, birth date), as well as credit cards and loyalty cards. Your local Neighbourhood Watch group may have a shredder to borrow - ask your CPO. For generic letters, simply tear out your name/address, before recycling. Keep receipts & always check statements.

**St Ives crash kills man, 94**

A 94-year-old man has been killed in a two-car crash in St Ives. The accident occurred at 9am on Saturday morning when a Holden Astra collided with a Toyota Hiace at the intersection of Mona Vale Rd and Stanley St. The impact of the collision caused the Holden Astra to crash into a traffic pole. The male passenger was taken to Royal North Shore Hospital in a critical condition, where he later died. The 90-year-old female driver was also taken to hospital where she was treated for

minor injuries.

A WILLOUGHBY mum has escaped drink driving charges, even after tearfully admitting in a television interview that she had been almost nine times over the legal blood-alcohol limit.

Despite Susan Lung's breath test of 0.445 — one of the highest recorded in NSW — police had to withdraw the charge thanks to a littleknown section of law.

It has left police seething and the woman, who has previous drink driving offences, back on the road.

#### **SOUTH TURRAMURRA**

1 The netball courts on Canoon Rd have been vandalised over recent weeks. Police say several fires were started in garbage bins at the courts. On Friday about 6.45pm police visited the courts after reports of antisocial behaviour and approached a car with two passengers. A 19-year-old man from the Central Coast was given a cannabis caution after police found the man chopping up what looked like green vegetation. The alleged drugs were seized.

#### **TURRAMURRA**

2 A wallet was stolen from a woman's handbag while the customer shopped at IGA supermarket. The 38-year-old woman's handbag was sitting in her trolley when the

wallet and other contents inside the bag went missing between 11.30am and 11.50am on Saturday. Police are reviewing CCTV footage.

### **ASQUITH**

3 A church service was interrupted at Asquith Scout Hall on Sunday when a vandal lit a garbage bin on fire outside the hall. AwesomeRock Church regularly meets inside the hall on Lords Ave. During the service, about 10.45am, a woman smelt smoke and found a large bin engulfed in flames outside the hall. Members of the church helped put the fire out. Methylated spirits containers were found nearby. Police are investigating.

### **THORNLEIGH**

4 A 43-year-old Central Coast man has been charged with high-range drink driving after swerving across lanes and driving dangerously near Thornleigh on Saturday night. Police pulled the gold Ford Falcon over just before midnight on Saturday on the Pacific Motorway, near Pennant Hills Rd. An unopened can of Bourbon and cola was allegedly inside the car. The driver failed a roadside breath test and was taken to Hornsby police station. He was tested at the station and returned a blood-alcohol level of 0.189, which is more than three times over the legal driving limit of 0.05. His licence was suspended on the spot and he will face Hornsby Court at a date yet to be confirmed.

### **THORNLEIGH**

5 An 85-year-old woman was injured after a car crash at Thornleigh Marketplace's carpark. The woman, driving a Honda Civic, went to leave the upper level of the carpark on Thursday about 2.30pm and accidentally accelerated when her foot slipped off the brake. She hit a brick wall and fractured her sternum and bruised her ribs. The RMS will determine whether the woman is physically fit to hold a driver's licence.

### **HORNSBY**

6 Police are hosting Coffee with a Cop events across the state on Tuesday. Kuring-gai Police Area Command will hold its event at the Blu Water Grill cafe in Hornsby Mall from 10am. Anyone is welcome to attend the casual event, which has no agendas or speeches. It is simply a meet and greet with police and a free coffee. Commander Superintendent Jenny Scholz will attend as well as other officers from the Kuring-gai command.

### **WEST PENNANT HILLS**

7 About \$10,000 worth of cash has been stolen from a property on Mildara Place. In total \$5000 in Australian dollars were stolen, as well as \$2000 US, 2000 euros, and 1000 Japanese Yen. The occupants returned home on Sunday to find their back door closed but unlocked. The property was robbed between noon on Saturday and 11.20am on Sunday. The master bedroom and study were raided and a gold bangle was also stolen. Police are investigating.

### **REGION WIDE**

8 Police are reminding drivers to be cautious as part of Yellow Ribbon National Road Safety Week. The State Government is joining the Safer Australian Roads and Highways campaign to encourage drivers to remember more than 1200 lives are lost on the nation's roads each year. Last year, 392 people lost their lives on the state's roads and about 12,000 people were seriously injured in NSW.

**7 May, from AU NEWS: Warning for parents after 12yo girl gets explicit messages in online game**

The mother of a 12-year-old South Australian girl has issued a warning about a popular online game, after her daughter received explicit messages from a predator.

She says parents need to be aware of the dangers of internet gaming.

Roblox looks innocent enough using cartoon like characters made out of lego blocks, but as some players are discovering it's anything but.

These are just some of the disturbing messages sent to a 12 year old girl from a predator who contacted her while she was playing the game. it's believed some words were misspelt deliberately to disguise his profile.

**7 May, from IDCARE: LETTERBOX THEFT ON THE RISE**

We know that criminals are targeting letterboxes in order to gather personal information. If you live in an apartment you're even more susceptible. Sometimes they get lucky and find items that can be directly misused such as credit cards or driver licence.

Thieves will also be interested in intercepting general mail such as bills etc, they will then attempt to gather more information about you in order to collect a full identity suite. For example a recent IDCARE client told us that criminals had intercepted a letter from her gym regarding her renewal. The criminal then called the gym, pretended to be the gym member and asked the staff member 'what do you have on your records re my birth date and driver licence number, as I think it might be wrong?'. The unsuspecting staff member gave them the information.

Our data tells us that many people who experience mail box theft also experience misuse of their information. This might be in the form of accounts being opened in their name, their email being compromised, and/or porting/SIM swap of their mobile number.

### **6 May, Check Out The Latest Theft Idea Called 'Sliders'**

It is a common place to be and certainly one that we visit often. Yes, you probably guessed it, its the gas station. The gas station is probably one of the most visited

places nowadays due to the fact that if you do happen to own a vehicle of any kind, unless is 100% electric, you need to fill up on gas to get to where ever you need to go. However, things have happen to take a turn for the worse aside of all the security cameras and once again thieves have found a way to go about their "business" at gas stations as well.

Here we have a video which shows an example of this kind of theft first hand and from a very clear view of a gas station camera . This lady happens to casually drive in right beside the gas station and get out of the car and stick the gas hose down her tank and punch in the number so she can purchase her gas. While she is doing her routine, you can very clearly see another car drive right up next to hers and park just close enough so that the guy can perform his act of getting out, remaining below eye sight view and open the drivers door and quickly snatch the purse. He immediately closes the door gently and gets into his own car and drives away very "normally".

Police are warning gas station customers in one California city to be on the lookout for thieves who have recently been taking wallets and purses from people's vehicles as they were pumping gas. In this video the news lady provides a couple of tips in which you can prevent finding your self to be the victim of such crime.

#### **3 May, from 9News Sydney: Teenagers caught breaking into guards' cabin, playing 'chicken' on Sydney trains**

Brazen teenagers have filmed themselves breaking into guards' compartments and dangerously playing chicken with moving trains on the Sydney Train network.

Last month, a group of trespassers narrowly escaped death after jumping onto the tracks at Petersham in the city's Inner West.

The group were attempting to break into the rear crew cabin on a train heading to the City-Circle, when an express service from Richmond headed straight towards them. They were forced to run, only just missing getting hit by the oncoming train.

**Here are some tips from our 20 favourite crime prevention tips for mailboxes.**

**Tip #1. DO KEEP YOUR MAILBOX LOCKED.** Remember, a lock is not a lock unless you use it.

**Tip #2. DO EMPTY YOUR MAILBOX EACH DAY.**

**Tip #3. DO CONSIDER A POST OFFICE BOX (P.O. BOX) FOR SECURE ITEMS.** For example, credit cards, cheque books.

**Tip #5. DO BE ALERT FOR MISSING BANK OR CREDIT CARD STATEMENTS, ETC.**

**Tip #8. ASK A FRIEND OR NEIGHBOUR TO CLEAR YOUR MAILBOX WHILE YOU ARE AWAY ON HOLIDAY.**

**Tip #9. CONSIDER A 'HOLD' ON YOUR MAIL WHILST YOU ARE AWAY.** (Also known as 'Stopping the mail.

**Tip #10. SUPPORT YOUR LOCAL NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH GROUP.** (Don't know? Phone Hornsby Police Station and ask for the Crime Prevention Officer. Isn't one in your area? Maybe offer to organise something yourself? )



Police have information she frequents the Dulwich Hill, Earlwood, Ballina, Cabbage Tree Island and Lismore areas.


She is described as being of Aboriginal/Torres Strait Islander appearance, with a medium build.

Can you help police locate wanted man, Bilal El Hassan?

Bilal El Hassan (aka Dante Lamis), aged 37, is wanted on two arrest warrants and a revocation of parole warrant.

The arrest warrants relate to two separate incidents, including a kidnapping and a fail to stop car crash.

Mr El Hassan is described as being of Mediterranean/Middle Eastern appearance, 180-185cm tall, with a muscular build. He was last known to have short brown hair and a beard but may have changed his appearance.

Detectives from the Drug and Firearms Squad have conducted numerous inquiries to locate the man, and are re-appealing for information from the community in relation to his current whereabouts.

He was previously known to frequent the Bankstown, Merrylands, Mt Druitt, Penrith, and Liverpool areas.

If sighted, members of the community are urged not to approach Mr El Hassan; instead, they should contact Triple Zero (000) immediately.
