26 August, from The Daily Telegraph: Grieving parents call for P-platers to complete responsible driver courses

BEREAVED parents are calling for young drivers to complete a mandatory responsible driving program similar to the Traffic Offenders Program as a condition of getting their license.

Roger Snaith, Peter Frazer and Eve Langham have all lost children to road trauma and present the NSW Enough is Enough Traffic Offenders Programs (TOP) to encourage traffic offenders to think about the harm they have caused.

However, they believe P-platers need to complete a similar program to adopt good behaviour behind the wheel.

“There are three main causes of road deaths: speed, alcohol and fatigue and who has control over these things? The driver does. It is their choice,” Mr Snaith told The Sunday Telegraph.

23August, from Kuring Gai Police Area Command: Weekly crime report

Drug detection - Waitara

About 4pm on 17 August, Police from the Hornsby Proactive Crime Team attached to Ku-ring-gai Police Area Command arrested a 19-year-old male in Edgeworth David Avenue Waitara for supply prohibited drug.

Police observed the male acting suspicious near a Volkswagen Golf. When police approached the male he appeared to be under the influence of an illicit drug.

The male was searched and police located on him 10 MDMA tablets. During the search of the vehicle, police located 3 acid tablets

The male arrested and taken to Hornsby Police Station. He was charged and is due to appear at Hornsby Local Court on 5 September.

Accident/PCA – Galston

About 11.30am Friday 17 August, a 42-year-old male driver had collided with the rear of a passenger bus on Galston Road.

Police arrive at the scene. Police spoke with the driver and could smell strong alcohol on his breath. He submitted to a breath test and returned a positive reading. He was arrested and taken to Hornsby Police Station for a breath analysis.

The driver returned a reading of 0.320 and was issued with a Court Attendance Notice for Drive with High Range PCA. His licence was suspended and is now due to appear at Hornsby Local Court on 27 September.

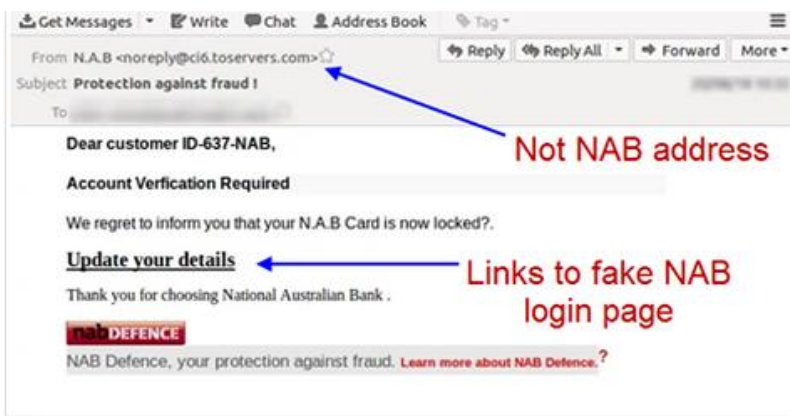

    Slow down to 40km/h around stopped emergency vehicles    

The new rule requires motorists to slow down to 40km/h when passing a stationary emergency vehicle displaying red and blue flashing lights.

The new rule also requires motorists to give way to any person on foot in the immediate area of the emergency vehicle.

Motorists should not increase their speed until they are at a safe distance past the vehicle, so as not to cause a danger to anyone in the vicinity.

HORNSBY

A Chinese herbal medicine practitioner has been granted conditional bail after being charged with manslaughter. The 52-year-old Hornsby man, Yun Sen Luo,

was arrested and charged on Thursday, August 16, following a post mortem examination of a 56-year-old woman who died on June 8. He is due to reappear in Hornsby Court on October 12.

HORNSBY

Police have charged a 48-year-old man following an incident at Westfield Hornsby where they said a mother-of-three was threatened in a tirade of abuse. A Kirribilli man allegedly threatened to kill and dismember the woman inside a parents' room at the shopping centre, on July 23 about 12.30pm. Police arrested the man about 11.15am last Thursday after he was seen by a witness returning to the same shopping centre, almost a month after the initial incident. Police have charged him with intimidation and he will front Hornsby Local Court on September 5.

WAITARA

A 33-year-old man from Waitara will front court after allegedly finding a credit card at a station and using it to buy goods. The man allegedly found the card which had been dropped at Pymble Station on August 7. He allegedly used it to make four purchases at Coles Turramurra that day and a further four purchases at 7/11 in Wahroonga and Coles Express in Hornsby the following day. Police approached him in the early hours of last Thursday morning in Waitara. Police said a substance alleged to be cannabis was found in his possession. He faces eight fraud charges, a drug charge and an outstanding warrant charge. He is due to appear at Hornsby Court on September 26.

DURAL

Police said they were involved in a six-hour negotiation with a man who locked himself inside his home on Sunday. Police were contacted about 4pm about a domestic dispute at a property in San Remo Pl. They said a 49-year-old man refused to come outside. He was arrested at 10.30pm after long negotiations with police. Noone was injured. The man has been charged with numerous offences

including destroying property, resisting police and intimidation. He will appear at Hornsby Local Court on September 25.

A man is in a critical condition in hospital after being struck by a car on Sydney's lower North Shore yesterday.

About 7.15pm (Friday 24 August 2018), emergency services were called to the intersection of Herbert Street and the Pacific Highway, St Leonards, following reports a pedestrian had been hit.

Police have been told the pedestrian, a 37-year-old man was attempting to cross the Pacific Highway when he was struck by a grey Holden Commodore station wagon.

He was treated at the scene before being taken to Royal North Shore Hospital where he remains in a critical condition.

The driver, a 46-year-old man, was uninjured and also taken to hospital for mandatory testing.

Officers from North Shore Police Area Command attended the scene and are investigating the circumstances surrounding the crash.

The hunt is on for those responsible for installing a do-it-yourself speed hump on McCarr's Creek Road at Church Point.

The hump was cemented across the road next to a National Parks sign that was also vandalised.

Apparently intended to quieten motorists, instead it has taken out a group of cyclists heading down the hill in the pre-dawn darkness, seriously injuring their lead rider.

He was scheduled to head overseas next week to compete in an international competition but instead is nursing concussion, broken ribs and a collar bone, while his bike was wrecked.

A drone flown over a Northern Rivers bushfire on Saturday caused the [NSW Rural Fire Service](#) to ground all firefighting aircraft in the area.

Flying your drone over or near a bushfire could put people, property or other aircraft at risk—and could cost you up to \$10,000 in fines or penalties.

Our 'Can I fly there?' app is updated with the latest fire and emergency operations for all Australian states and territories (except Northern Territory).

Remember, drones must not be operated in a way that creates a hazard to another aircraft, person or property.
