12 July: Motorcyclist dies - Pacific Highway, Brooklyn Sunday, 12 July 2015
05:05:25 PM

A motorcyclist has died following a crash near Brooklyn. Shortly before 4pm today (Sunday 12 July 2015), police and other emergency services were called to a section of the Pacific Highway, just south of the Brooklyn turn-off, after a northbound motorcyclist crashed into a rock-wall. The rider, a 31-year-old man, was pronounced dead at the scene.

Police are now conducting inquiries into the matter and the Pacific Highway will remain closed in both directions for a number of hours. Motorists should use the

M1 in the interim. Police are urging anyone with information in relation to this incident to call **Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000**.

11 July: An investigation is underway after a woman's body was discovered at Hornsby.

Emergency services were called to bushland off Rosemead Road about 2.30pm today (Saturday 11 July 2015), after a member of the public found the body on a fire trail. The body was located approximately 800metres from the road. Officers from Kuring-Gai Local Area Command have established a crime scene which will continue to be forensically examined overnight. The woman has not been formally identified and a post mortem will be conducted to determine the cause of death.

An investigation is underway with local detectives being assisted by officers from the State Crime Command's Homicide Squad. It's unknown whether the woman's death is suspicious. Investigators are appealing for anyone with information, or who witnessed suspicious activity in the area, to come forward.

09 July: Witnesses sought, 9/7/15 Hornsby police are seeking possible witnesses to a pedestrian collision in Hornsby.

About 6pm Wednesday 8th an 83 year old female was walking along Northcote Road, Hornsby. About this time a Red Toyota Corolla was travelling in a westerly direction along Northcote Road and when near Sharon Close has collided with the female pedestrian, who was believed to be on the roadway. The female pedestrian was thrown over the bonnet and landed several metres away. The driver stopped and rendered first aid until Ambulance officers and police have arrived at the scene soon after, the pedestrian was stabilised and taken to RNSH with serious head and abdominal injuries.

Hornsby police are investigating the collision and are seeking any person who was in the area, that may have witnessed the collision, or had seen the pedestrian prior to the collision to contact Hornsby Police.

The female was wearing a purple knit cardigan, grey checked jacket, blue track pants and brown Velcro shoes at the time.






09 July, from NRMA Motoring & services: TEST TIME/ANSWER: Who must give way?

- b) The pedestrian



Hornsby Police are hosting **Coffee with a Cop on Wednesday 22nd July**. Program offers opportunity to meet local officers and discuss community


issues. The event is to be held in **Berowra Heights** on 22nd July, officers from Kuring-Gai LAC and community members can come together in an informal, neutral space to discuss community issues, build relationships, and drink coffee.

All community members are invited to attend. The event begins at **12.00pm on Wednesday 22nd July at Darcie's Café in the Turner Road Shopping complex (next to IGA)** police will buy you a coffee and talk about any issues concerning you.

Coffee with a Cop provides a unique opportunity for community members to ask questions and learn more about the Police work in the Hornsby Kuring-Gai area. The majority of contact with police has been with the public during emergencies, or emotional situations. Those situations are not always the most effective times for relationship building with the community, and some community members may feel that officers are unapproachable on the street. Coffee with a Cop breaks down barriers and allows for a relaxed, one-on-one interaction.

“We hope that community members will feel comfortable to ask questions, bring concerns, or simply get to know our officers,” said David Jones Police Superintendent. “These interactions are the foundation of community partnerships.”

Coffee with a Cop originated in the USA and is an Australian initiative supported by The NSW Police Force. Similar events are being held across Australia, as Local Area Commands strive to make lasting connections with the communities they serve. The program aims to advance the practice of community policing through improving relationships between police officers and community members one cup of coffee at a time.


Monday 20 July: 'All Areas' Neighbourhood Watch (NHW) meeting. 6pm Hornsby Police Station - **Why should I attend?**

You can improve your home security. Take these steps to ensure your home is protected:

- Ensure your street number is clearly visible from the road
- Letterbox secured with lock
- Meter box secured with Western Power approved lock to protect power supply
- Trees and shrubs are trimmed to eliminate hiding places - your property should be clearly visible from the street.
- Remove loose objects from the yard so offenders can't use them to break in
- Ensure gates are locked
- Movement sensors installed to front and side lighting
- Are sensors/globes high enough to avoid easy reach?
- Lock Garden sheds and workshops
- Is the Garage/carport secure?
- Are security screens fitted to doors and windows?
- Do windows have key locks?
- Are windows and doors locked even when you are home?

eWatch St Ives #2 have been going since the idea was formulated in October 2011 following on from a talk given by eWatch St Ives #1 coordinator, Dick Whitaker (now retired). The eWatch covers an area of approximately 400 households. They are an active group, coordinated by Rob Sawyer. He connects via regular weekly emails to those households that are registered with him.

In February 2015, Rob organised a Crime Prevention and Community Safety Day at Toolang Oval, St Ives with Kuring-gai NSW Police command. From the Hornsby Advocate, 09 July:

DRIVING AND MOBILE PHONES SIMPLY DON'T MIX

In case you forgot – don't use a mobile phone while driving. Your police are issuing expensive fines every day of the week to drivers who use their phones while driving. They are easy to pick, driving slower than surrounding traffic, wandering across their lane and the "mobile nod" of looking down at the screen. Studies show that you have a four times higher risk of a serious crash requiring hospitalisation and are as impaired as having a blood alcohol reading of 0.1. This is so dangerous that there must be an active effort to stamp this out. The fines are up to over \$400 if in a school zone. – Detective Inspector Jon Gross, Kuring-Gai local area command

SOUTH TURRAMURRA A men's Rolex watch worth \$9000 was among a number of items stolen from a home in Maxwell St between 11.30pm Saturday and 3.30am Sunday. Also stolen were figurines, a laptop and paperwork. A ground floor rear door to the property was jemmied open. The watch is described as a silver and chrome Sea-Dweller with a black face

ASQUITH A construction worker was taken to Royal North Shore Hospital after he fell about 6m from scaffolding at a building site on the Pacific Highway on Monday morning. The 42-year-old man was conscious and breathing when he was treated by ambulance officers. Police have referred the incident to WorkCover.

HORNSBY A man was allegedly punched in the head and upper body at a property in Derby Rd on Saturday night. Police said the 45-year-old victim heard a knock at the door and yelling outside his home about 10.30pm. He opened the door and a man allegedly pushed the door open and entered the property with the pair getting into a struggle. About 2am Sunday police attended a property at Wahroonga where they arrested a 58-year-old male. He was charged with aggravated break and enter, commit actual bodily harm and maliciously inflict actual bodily harm.

TURRAMURRA Police are investigating whether two cars involved in an accident on Karuah Rd on Monday night were involved in an illegal street race. About 9.30pm police were called to a collision between a Volkswagen and Kia. Police allege the cars were going the wrong way on a one-way street. The drivers, both 17 and holding P1 licences, were breath-tested. The Kia driver returned a positive result and a further breath analysis returned a reading of .046. His licence was suspended.

HORNSBY Two bicycles, a number of power tools, a generator and two computers were stolen from the garage of a property in William St between 4pm Monday and 10am Tuesday. The total value of the property is almost \$9000. The thieves left behind a set of bolt cutters which will be forensically examined by police.

NORMANHURST A laptop and iPad worth \$450 were stolen from a home in Nicholas Crescent between 7.45am and 5pm on Tuesday.

THORNLEIGH A driver was reaching down to pick up his glasses from the floor when he crashed into a rock wall on the Comenarra Parkway about 11pm Saturday. There were three passengers in the vehicle but no-one suffered serious injuries. The 23-year-old driver received a ticket for negligent driving.

PYMBLE A woman was bitten by a dog in Bloomsbury Ave on Friday morning. Police said about 10.45am the 21-year-old was outside with her dog, a swiss shepherd, which was offleash. Two german shepherds then escaped their yard and bit the woman and her dog. Police will view CCTV footage of the incident and

review the matter with Ku-ring-gai Council.

Women in blue celebrate a century

KURING-GAI Local Area Command will celebrate 100 years of women in policing with a special event in Hornsby next week.

It will include a baton relay around the CBD, recruitment advice and information about the history of women in policing.

"Anyone who is interested is invited to come down and have a look," Sergeant Natalie Parle said.

Sgt Parle is one of about 46 women police officers based at Kuring-gai LAC. She joined the NSW Police Force 15 years ago and has worked

at Manly and Gosford stations and at the State Crime Command.

"It's a great job because of the variety of the work and the flexibility," she said.

Senior Constable Karin Ryan has seen a lot of changes since she became a police officer 30 years ago.

"When I first joined a lot of the old sergeants didn't like sending you (female officers) out on Friday and Saturday nights because they thought it was too busy and they didn't think the women would cope, even though we went through the same

training and had to cope with the same things as men," she said.

"Back then you were also pushing to get 25 per cent of women in the class. Now there are a lot more."

Detective Snr Constable Susie Watkins is on secondment at Kuring-gai LAC from the Professional Standards Command.

"I enjoy being a detective," she said. "You get to work on the more serious crimes."

AQUATIC-THEMED MURAL TO DETER GRAFFITI

YOU'VE probably encountered a giant red octopus while driving along the Pacific Highway at Killara.

Artist Janne Birkner was employed by Sydney Water to create an aquatic-themed mural on the facade of the Killara pumping station, a graffiti hotspot.

The building has been hit by vandals several times this year and is one of the most tagged Sydney Water assets.

The purpose of this initiative is to stop graffiti on Sydney Water assets, which cost the company more than \$140,000 each year.

Mr Birkner said he chose the red octopus so it would stand out.

"It took me a full working day ... I'm pretty proud of my work," he said.

"I thought, because it was for Sydney Water, I would choose something to do with water. I also wanted to challenge myself and do an octopus."

Mr Birkner has been employed by Sydney Water for a similar mural in Katoomba but he specialises in animal-themed artworks.

"The wall was really bad before because it was all tagged up. It was just dull full stop. (There was) no colour coming from the building at all. I do feel happy that it's on a very visible area and hopefully people enjoy it."

He studied at the National Art School last year and does work for not-for-profit



organisation Street Art Murals Australia.

The mural is 32sq m.

Artist Thomas Jackson painted a similar aquatic-themed mural over a graffiti-hit wall at Pymble Reservoir earlier this year.

Similar murals have been completed on Sydney Water assets in Marrickville, Bronte and Wollongong.
