27 July: Kuring-Gai Police investigating assault of 11 yr old schoolboy at Wahroonga

About 3.10pm on Friday 24th July 2015 the victim, an 11 yr old boy was waiting to cross Edgeworth David Ave at the intersection with Myra St at Wahroonga when an adult male pulled him by his backpack down beside him upon the seat where he was seated. He then placed his arm around the boy, who was able to then stand up and walk away before going home and informing his parents who called Police.

The male has been described to Police as of Asian appearance, aged in his 60's with a round face and short black hair. He was wearing grey pants and a brown jacket, and holding a black walking stick.


26 July: Photographs of a degraded quilt located, along with the remains of a child, at Wynarka earlier this month, have been released by Task Force Mallee investigators today.

Following close forensic examination, details of the 90cm x 90cm quilt have been released to the public in a bid to identify the child, who police believe was a young girl aged two-and-a-half to four at the time of her death. Her skeletal remains were found along with a suitcase, items of clothing and the quilt near the Karoonda Highway about 2km west of the Wynarka township in the Murray Mallee region on 15 July.

### 25 July, from our neighbouring The Hills command.

A bank employee has been charged with defrauding a financial institution after allegedly stealing over \$400,000. Police will allege between January 2013 and April 2015, a 51-year-old woman, who worked as a teller in a Castle Hill bank, stole \$429,185 from seven elderly customers' accounts. The customers affected have been contacted and fully reimbursed by the organisation.

On Thursday (23 July 2015), the woman attended Castle Hill Police Station where she was issued with a future court attendance notice, charged with larceny as a clerk and seven counts of obtain benefit by deception. She was granted conditional bail to appear before Parramatta Local Court on 9 September 2015.

# 24 July, from Crime Stoppers: MALICIOUS DAMAGE...

Malicious damage is broadly defined as the intentional 'destruction or defacement of public, commercial and private property'. Common forms of malicious damage include vandalism, such as breaking windows, keying cars, knocking over letterboxes, and graffiti. Graffiti is the act of marking property with writing, symbols or graphics, and is illegal when committed without the property owner's consent.

- the majority of malicious damage incidents occur between 3 pm and midnight with a peak between 6 pm and 9 pm;
- most offences occur between Friday and Sunday;
- alcohol is an important contributing factor to many malicious damage offences;
- regional areas experience higher rates of malicious damage offending;
- the most common vandalism targets are residential properties, private cars and commercial premises;
- residential properties and education facilities are frequently targeted by graffitists;
   and
- young people are generally the main perpetrators of graffiti as well as other forms of malicious damage.

# 24 July, from ACMA: SCAM ALERT: Fake Telstra refund emails

The ACMA has received hundreds of reports from Australians concerning Telstra refund emails. These emails are a phishing scam designed to trick people into clicking links and giving away personal information.



Here is an example of one of the scam emails in circulation. The subject line is: 'Your Telstra bill for account 2000XXXXXXXXX is refunded'. The sender address was Telstraemailbill\_noreply9(at)online.Telstra.com. The scammers have copied real information from Telstra and at first sight it looks legitimate. But there are also obvious signs it is a scam. Can you pick them?

#### DON'T LEAVE YOUR CHILDREN IN THE CAR

Leaving your child or any child in a car is not only reprehensible, it is illegal. As I type this message we have a father in the dock to be charged for leaving his two-year-old in a car. While we were lucky it is a cooler time of the year, at no time is it reasonable or legal to leave a child

unsupervised in a vehicle.

So much can happen. Children have died in the past.

Your police are outraged at this callous disregard for child safety and have zero tolerance.

We are sure the courts and Family and Community Services (formerly DOCS) will view it as seriously as we do.

WAHROONGA A shipping container at a building site in Woniora Ave has had its lock forced open between Monday, July 20, 3.30pm and Tuesday, July 21, 7am. Power tools and other building tools were stolen.

WAHROONGA Police are investigating after a home was broken into on Monday, July 20, between 11.15am and 3.30pm. An amount of jewellery was stolen from the Tanderra St address. Inquiries are continuing.

**GALSTON** Police are making inquiries after malicious damage was reported at a block of four townhouses in Sylvan St between 1pm, Thursday, July 16 and 9.30am, Saturday, July 18. All four letterboxes within the development had the front panels forced open. Police believe someone has attempted to steal some mail from one of the letterboxes. It is unknown whether anything was stolen from the other letterboxes. Opened mail from a different address in Galston was also found on the ground at the block.

HORNSBY HEIGHTS Two vehicles on Spedding Rd were broken into between 4pm Thursday, July 16 and 7.45am, Friday, July 17. It is unknown how the offender broke into the first car, a Honda Accord. The offender had rummaged through the interior of the car but did not steal anything. At the same location, a Suburu was ransacked after it was left unlocked. The victim's wallet was stolen, as well as change and bank cards.

**WAHROONGA** At 10.50pm, Monday, July 20, police stopped a silver Commodore travelling on the Pacific Hwy. A roadside breath test allegedly tested positive for alcohol. The male driver of the car, 31, was arrested and taken to Hornsby Police Station. A subsequent breath test conducted at the station returned a positive result of .059. The driver was charged with low-range drink-driving and will appear at Hornsby Local Court on August 6.

6 Rosamond St was broken into between 10.30pm, Thursday, July 16 and 7am, Friday, July 17. The home's ground floor rear door was opened and \$150 was stolen from a bag. The victim said she heard a side gate opening at 5.30am Friday but didn't think much of it.

**HORNSBY** A woman has attempted to pay for goods with counterfeit money at a chemist. About 12.40pm on Wednesday, July 15, a woman, described as of Asian appearance, about 20 to 30 years old, medium build and wearing black pants and ugg boots, was captured on CCTV footage handing over a \$100 note to the chemist sales assistant. The assistant took the note and told police it felt different to usual Australian currency. The assistant saw the woman holding three \$100 notes but only attempted to pay with one. When the assistant questioned the authenticity of the money, the woman walked out of the store without making any purchases. Police are reviewing CCTV footage.

TURRAMURRA At about 4am on Friday, July 17, a cyclist business was broken into. Two men's yeti brand mountain bikes were stolen along with an amount of cash contained in a safe. The bikes are valued at \$800 and \$900. CCTV footage shows a male, using a set of bolt cutters, cutting through the wire security mesh and smashing the windows before gaining access. Police are reviewing the footage and will dust for fingerprints.


