08 August: Missing Persons Mythbusters

Myth: If Australians are missing overseas, there is nothing that can be done.

Answer: The AFP and the Dept of Foreign Affairs & Trade work with agencies overseas in investigating such cases where Australians are missing overseas. Tracing agencies such as the Australian Red Cross, the Salvation Army, and the International Social Service Australia also work to reunite people missing overseas.

06 August, from our neighbouring North Shore command: A woman has been charged after a vehicle search on Sydney's north shore allegedly turned up drugs and stolen mail.

About 12.30pm yesterday (Wednesday 5 August 2015), police pulled over a vehicle on Greenwich Road, Greenwich. Police spoke to the male driver of the car and a female passenger. The car was then searched with police allegedly locating

0.5 grams of crystal methamphetamine ('ice') as well as a large number of mail items including bank statements, credit cards, and copies of driver's licences and credit cards. Police also allegedly located a modified mailbox key.

The 33-year-old woman was arrested and taken to Chatswood Police Station where she was charged with possess prohibited drug; two counts of obtain benefit by deception; one count of armed with intent; and seven counts of goods in custody. She was refused bail to appear at Hornsby Local Court today (Thursday 6 August 2015).

WHAT LOCKING SCREWS??? Neighbourhood Watch Australasia Community Funding this year have kindly supported the Neighbourhood Watch groups in the Hornsby and Ku-ring-gai areas by helping with the purchase of Car Rego Plate Locking Screws to be used as **FREE** give-aways to the community to promote Crime Prevention.

HOW DO THEY WORK? Car Rego Plate Locking Screws are one-way screws that are put in with a normal screw driver, but are then unable to be taken out. This prevents the plates being stolen and subsequently used in a crime, such as the theft of petrol by not paying after pumping.

HOW DO I GET THEM OUT THEN? Pop to any Police station where they have a special tool to easily remove them.

In 2012 the NSW Government abolished the option to register for organ donation through the driver's licence system. The Australian Organ Donor Register, run by Medicare, is the only way to record a decision about donation after death. Cannabis and The Law

You are breaking the law if you possess, use, grow, import or sell cannabis (marijuana), cannabis resin (hash) or hash oil. In NSW, if you are found guilty of possessing or using cannabis, you could get a fine of up to \$2,200, and/or other penalties including community service work or a term in prison of up to 2 years. These penalties apply to both adults and young people aged between 10 and 18 years. For growing, importing or selling cannabis, the penalties are more severe. The severity of the penalty depends on the amount of cannabis, if it was being sold, and if you have prior convictions. You may get a criminal record if you are found guilty of possessing, selling or growing cannabis. This makes it hard to get a job, a credit card, or a visa to travel to other countries.

From the Hornsby Advocate, 06 August:

ON THE SEARCH FOR MISSING PERSONS This is Missing Persons Week. An estimated 35,000 people are reported missing to Australian police each year — that's one person every 15 minutes; 99.5 per cent of people are located and most within a week of being reported missing. People go missing for many reasons, including family and relationship conflicts, mental illness or sometimes suspicious circumstances. This is an issue that has the potential to affect any family, irrespective of background. It is important that police are notified of a missing person as soon as possible. There is no need to wait 24 hours (that's a myth). **Call 13 14 44 to report a missing person.** Detective Inspector Jon Gross Kuring-gai Local Area Command.

BEROWRA WATERS A tradesman suffered two broken wrists, a broken nose, and other facial injuries, after he fell from a ladder while doing plastering work at a home on Monday. The 42-year-old was climbing down the 2.5m ladder when he lost his balance and fell about 10.30am. He was taken to Westmead Hospital.

WEST PYMBLE A man discovered a hand grenade while working underneath his deceased parents' home in Dunoon Ave, about 2pm on Friday. Police set up a 100m exclusion zone, with four houses in all directions evacuated. The Army Explosive Ordinance Unit examined the grenade and advised that it still contained

highly-explosive material, but the detonator had been removed.

HORNSBY A worker on his first day on the job fell about 3.5m between wooden flooring on to concrete at a unit construction site in Pound Rd, about 2.40pm on Monday. A plasterboard sheet then fell on top of the 18-year-old. He was taken to Royal North Shore Hospital with a broken right wrist and left ankle. The incident has been referred to WorkCover.

BROOKLYN A man, 64, suffered a cardiac arrest after starting a bushwalk about 7am on Saturday. The man and a friend set off from William St, and walked about 200m, when he collapsed. Other walkers stopped and started CPR until paramedics arrived. The man was taken by ambulance helicopter to Royal North Shore Hospital in a serious but stable condition.

NORMANHURST Five laptops, an Xbox, cash and car keys were stolen from a Stuart Ave property between 7.40am and 11.50am on Saturday. Police said a witness noticed young people leaving the scene and followed them to a nearby location. Investigations are continuing.

WAHROONGA Two mountain bikes, worth \$1400, were stolen from a storage cage at a unit complex in Bundarra Ave South between July 26 and 31. One was a Giant "Trek" mountain bike, and the other was a Merida TSS model.

THORNLEIGH A side window of a hall at the Seventh-day Adventist Church, in Yarrara Rd, was smashed between 6pm on Saturday and 7pm on Monday. A broken bottle was found on the floor inside the hall.

WEST PENNANT HILLS A man was at his home in Sunridge Place, at 5.45pm on Thursday, when he heard the front door open. He went downstairs to find three strangers at the front door. They ran off when they saw him. Those who may have seen people acting suspiciously in the area at the time are asked to phone Crime Stoppers.

THORNLEIGH Police believe a drill was used in an attempted break-in at Thornleigh West Public School over the weekend. Between 5pm on Friday and

7am on Monday, a door to the uniform shop and a side door were tampered with, but no entry was gained.

DURAL Thieves who broke into a real estate business on Old Northern Rd last week attempted to drill open the safe, but failed. The break-in happened sometime after 8.15pm on Thursday, and was discovered on Friday.

THORNLEIGH A 35year-old woman had an Apple iPhone 5C stolen from a trolley at Woolworths between 10.40am and 10.45am on Saturday.

CRIME PREVENTION Focus on Taxi Travel

- Consider phoning for a taxi from a safe place, such as your place of work, rather than hailing one from the street.
- Specify the route you would like to take to your driver. If your driver takes an alternative route, be assertive and ask him/her to take your specified route.
- Sit in the back of the taxi and consider travelling with friends.
- Take note of the taxi company, driver's name and car number. Let the driver know that you've noted their taxi number.
- At night consider asking your driver to wait for you until you are safely inside your destination.

BOATIES GET SINKING FEELING OVER NEW PARKING LIMITS FOR TRAILERS [edited]

NEW rules to limit the amount of time boat trailers can be parked in suburban streets are creating concern for local boaties. Vessels on trailers can now be impounded if they are left parked on a street for more than three months. BOAT

owners, a councillor and even the Sailors Bay Sea Scouts have expressed concern about their floating hulks being left high and dry by new laws that can impound a vessel when parked on the street for too long. Boat trailers now need to move within three months or risk being locked up under new laws introduced this week.

Guns on rise in suburbs

THERE are thousands more registered guns on the north shore than five years ago with hunting and target shooting driving most of the sales, new figures reveal. Across the north shore there were 18,909 registered firearms between 4,168 licence holders in May 2015. Suburbs including Chatswood, Roseville, Turramurra, Hornsby and Mosman had more than 1000 guns registered to residents.
