24 August, from the Hornsby Advocate: Helicopter aerial patrols across parts of Hornsby shire to check powerlines

People across the Hornsby shire are being urged not to be frightened by low-flying helicopters this week. Ausgrid has issued a warning ahead its annual helicopter inspections of powerlines in rural areas including Berowra, Mt Kuring-gai, Gosford and Somersby from Wednesday, August 26 to Friday, August 28. The helicopter

will fly close to overhead powerlines between 7.30am and 5pm, with Ausgrid advising people to take steps to avoid distress to animals because of concerns the helicopters may frighten livestock. TransGrid have also released a schedule for its aerial inspections, conducted by one white helicopter.

22 August, from Queensland Police: Operation Roam results in arrest in WA

Detectives from Western Australia have today arrested a man in Bremer Bay who is wanted in Queensland for an alleged burglary with violence offence in 2006. The information was received as part of Operation Roam, a joint operation with Crime Stoppers Australia Ltd. The information received resulted in the arrest of the 38-year-old man in Bremer Bay today. Queensland Police will be seeking the man's extradition next week when he faces court in Western Australia.

21 August, from our neighbouring The Hills command: TRAIL BIKES Please share!!!

If you or your friends have trail bikes, it is likely to **increase your risks of being**

broken into.

If you are selling a trail bike please **do not have the person viewing the bike come to your house** or where the bike is stored.

Several victims are being targetted on Facebook buy and sell pages, Gumtree and Ebay. The viewer may be sussing your house out, security and where the bike is stored when they come and have a look at the trail bike. They leave after telling you they will think about it and within days your bike may get stolen. Do not give the viewer your address.

Please be vigilant at all times when selling any item online. There are a few steps you can take to reduce your chances of getting broken into and your whole world being turned upside down.

1. Store them off site at a secure location.
2. If you register with a trail bike club, try and provide a P.O box or your work address.
3. If you ride at places on the weekend with your trail bikes in tow, make sure you are not followed.
4. If you store them in your garage, do not have them visible to the street when you have your door open. Put up a screen, or keep your door closed.
5. If you are cleaning them after being on them, clean them in your backyard, not on your front lawn.
6. Make sure you fully secure them via chains and padlocks. If they are on a trailer put a wheel clamp on that as well.
7. Take a photo of the bikes and the serial numbers / vin #
8. Unfortunately these are easy money for crooks, change a few colours on them and they will sell them.

20 August: Recent activities by Kuring-Gai LAC results in variety of arrests

Multiple arrests for Drink Driving & License Offences

* Shortly after midnight on the weekend before last Police were patrolling on Pennant Hills Road at Thornleigh when a Jeep was observed being driven without its headlights on. Police stopped the vehicle and the driver was breath tested. He passed the breath test however as a result of establishing that his License is Suspended until the year 2025 he will be attending Hornsby Local Court on a charge of Drive while Suspended.

* About 12.30am Saturday 15th while performing Random Breath Testing duties in West Pymble a vehicle being driven by a 27 yr old female was stopped. The driver failed her roadside test and later returned a blood alcohol reading within the Mid Range. She was charged with Mid Range PCA and her licence has been confiscated and suspended. She will be appearing before Hornsby Local Court later this month.

* Also on Saturday night around 11pm while conducting Random Breath Testing on the Pacific Highway at Berowra Police stopped a vehicle driven by a 27 year old male. Upon failing his roadside test he was arrested and taken to Hornsby Police Station where he returned a Mid Range blood alcohol reading. He was charged with Mid Range PCA and his licence was also confiscated and suspended.

Police arrest a number of persons after searches locate Drugs and Weapons

* Around 8am on Tuesday 18th Police patrolling in Mt.Colah had their attention drawn to the 21 yr old male driving a motor vehicle. Upon stopping the vehicle a search of it and the driver was conducted resulting in a total of 7 bags of a variety of prohibited drugs being located in the car and on the driver. Additionally a credit card was located and seized by Police. As a result of their investigations the driver of the vehicle was charged and faces Hornsby Local Court for Possession of Prohibited Drugs and being in Custody of Stolen Property.

* While patrolling in the Brooklyn area around 3am Thursday the 20th officers noticed the occupants of a white 4WD acting suspiciously. The vehicle was

stopped and the 23yr old male occupant and his girlfriend spoken to by officers. A subsequent search of the vehicle located a quantity of prohibited drugs and weapons including a large meat cleaver within the vehicle. Both the male and his girlfriend will be appearing at Hornsby Local Court on charges of Possession of Prohibited Drugs and Possession of offensive weapons.

Temper Tantrum gets expensive after Road Rage at St.Ives

* After a motor cyclist did not move off when traffic lights had turned green the driver of the vehicle behind him tooted his horn to alert the cyclist to the fact. The motor cyclist then attempted to undertake a " Wheelie " from the intersection on his cycle's rear wheel only. Science and Physics being the unrepentent forces that they are, the cycle progressed vertically rather than the intended horizontal departure, consequently flipping and landing back on the cyclist.

Apparently unconvinced this was his own fault, the cyclist removed his helmet and smashed the windscreen of the helpful motorist's vehicle still waiting behind him. Photos were taken, Police were called.....Cyclist charged with Maliciously Damaging property.

August 20, from our neighbouring North Shore command: North Shore Police are seeking your help: Jewellery Theft – Chatswood

North Shore Police were called to a Jewellery store in Chatswood CBD on Tuesday 4th August shortly after 5pm after a male stole a tray of valuable rings from the store. Officers were conducting a footpatrol through the shopping centre when they were flagged down by the store manager who informed them that a male had just fled the store with a number of mens rings. Moments earlier a man had been inside the store about mens rings and was shown a number of rings with diamond settings. As the man has asked a question about one of the rings the staff from the store moved away from the counter and the male fled the store.



It is believed that the male described as being of a Mediterranean or middle eastern appearance, aged in his early 20's with short shaved dark hair, unshaven or stubble on his face with a moustache, he was wearing a brown leather style jacket with black sleeves and a hood, black pants and Nike shoes with a black/grey and red pattern.

He was last seen running through the shopping centre, Police believe he left the centre via a Spring Street exit.

Chatswood Police would like to speak to the male in this photo as they believe he may be able to assist them with their enquiries. Reminders will be provided 10 days before registration is due to expire, again two days before and on the day if payment still has not been received. The reminder will show the date your vehicle's registration expires and the status of your CTP/Greenslip. It will also let you know if an e-safety inspection is required to renew your registration.

At certain locations, when you apply for a licence, your card will be posted to you at no extra cost. When you apply for or renew your licence you will be given a paper receipt. The receipt will act as proof of licence

status until your new photo licence arrives.

DID YOU KNOW (3)? New parking regulations restrict the parking of boat trailers in the street to 3 months. From the Daily Telegraph, August 18: Smokers required to butt out before ordering at McDonald's drive-through

In accordance with the State Government's new smoking laws, McDonald's restaurants across NSW have banned smoking from any area within 4m where food is served. A McDonald's spokeswoman said the signs were at the discretion of the licensee. "In line with new outdoor smoking laws, McDonald's restaurants also enforce a no-smoking area within 4m of dining areas," the spokeswoman said. "Some of our restaurants are also asking customers not to smoke at drive-through windows."

The new laws, which came into effect on July 1, empower NSW Health Inspectors to issue on-the-spot fines of up to \$300 per individual offender and \$5500 fines for companies which fail to comply.

From the Hornsby Advocate, 20 August:

HORNSBY A 41-year-old woman was the victim of a frightening road rage incident on Friday morning. The woman was driving on Peats Ferry Rd about 7.30am when she let a bus merge into traffic, angering a male driver in a Holden ute. He then began tailgating her. At the intersection of Bridge Rd the woman slowed down so the bus could turn, infuriating the male. He followed her into Sherbrook Rd and Burdett St, where the distressed woman stopped her car and phoned her husband. The man also pulled over, got out of his ute and yelled at the woman and punched his fist. He then got back into his car and drove off. The woman has made a statement to police, including details of the ute's registration number. Investigations are continuing.

WESTLEIGH A house in Westleigh Rd was extensively damaged by fire last Thursday morning. About 11am the 74-year-old owner of the home started his car, a Hyundai Getz, parked in the garage. Upon ignition an explosion occurred inside the vehicle. The man used a garden hose to try to extinguish the flames without success. A neighbour called triple-0. The fire quickly spread into the ceiling of the garage and to the house. The man was taken to Hornsby Hospital and then to Royal North Shore Hospital's burns unit, suffering smoke inhalation and slight burns to his chest.

HORNSBY Jewellery and two mobile phones were stolen from a house in Ethel St between 11.05am and 12.20pm Monday.

WAHROONGA Police attended a granny flat in Isis St and spoke to a 34-year old

male about 12.20am Saturday. They allegedly located 98 grams of cannabis and a number of drug-related items inside the property. The man has been charged with possessing a prohibited drug.

BEROWRA HEIGHTS Police are appealing to smash repairers to let them know if a silver Mercedes with a missing panel is brought in. It follows an incident in Turner Rd about 3pm Friday when a Mazda 3 was side-swiped. Police found the Mercedes panel on the ground nearby.

WESTLEIGH Police were called to an accident at the intersection of Elouera and Duffy roads, about 12.45am Tuesday, where a Holden Commodore had hit a brick fence. The driver had left the scene. Police attended a nearby house and spoke to a 21-year-old man. He has been charged with driving under the influence of alcohol and negligent driving.

GALSTON The owner of a property in Hansen Ave heard a loud noise about 9.15pm Saturday and found his letterbox blown up.
