04 May: Hornsby Police news, 4/5/15 The following relate to local issues in the Kuring gai Local Area Command.

Incident: Car crash...

Time/Date: About 7.35pm Saturday 2nd

Place: M1 Motorway Berowra

Details: A 40 year old male driving a Subaru was travelling south on the M1, for unknown reasons the car has veered to the centre median area and collided with the rock wall, ending up on its side. The driver was not hurt in the crash. Police attended and subjected the driver to a breath test with was allegedly positive for alcohol. The driver returned a reading of .109 on a subsequent test. The driver had his licence suspended by police and he was charged. He is to face Hornsby Court on the 28th May.

Incident: Fail to stop crash

Time/Date: About 4.15pm Thursday 30th

Place: Clarinda Street, Hornsby

Details: A sight impaired woman was walking along Clarinda Street with the aid of a Labrador guide dog. As the woman has crossed the road she heard a car

screeching its tyres and with limited vision saw her dog get hit by a white car. The driver stopped momentarily yelling at the woman then drove off. The woman managed to call a friend then attended a local vet for treatment for her guide dog, who suffered internal injuries and a fractured ankle. The woman was unhurt but obviously distressed over the incident.

Incident: 2 incidents of oxy acetylene attacks on machines.

Details: Sunday 3rd night time oxy acetylene was used on an ATM in Mount Kuring gai, it appears the attack was not successful but caused the machine to catch on fire. In another incident oxy acetylene was also used on a vending machine on Normanhurst railway station. This attack at about 3.50am on Saturday the 2nd was also unsuccessful.

You must be advising customers if the car has been written off or wrecked, if the car had significant damage, major modifications and repair work, or if you suspect the odometer has been tampered with. You must also notify the customer about the dealer guarantee that applies and ensure you do your PPSR and other relevant checks to avoid non-compliance which could cost you later.

01 May from acmadotgov: SCAM ALERT: Phone scammers posing as 'Marriott Hotels'

The ACMA has received a number of reports from members of the public about automated voice calls from the... 'Marriott Hotel'. The call encourages the recipient to 'Press 1' to redeem a prize of a free stay at a luxurious hotel. THIS IS A SCAM!

Where members of the public do 'Press 1', they are taken to a human operator who will ask a number of questions, including a request for credit card details. You should never provide your credit card details under these circumstances. If you receive a call, or repeated calls like this, simply hang up.

Every year around 130 bushwalkers get lost and/or require rescuing. Most walkers are found within 24hrs, but occasionally a weekend adventure can turn to

tragedy. The Blue Mountains National Park covers over a quarter of a million hectares of land and has Australia's largest network of walking tracks covering over 250 kilometers. It is also NSW's busiest park with an estimated four million visitors a year. Much of the park is remote and difficult to access, except via foot, this makes it extremely attractive to bushwalkers from all over the world.

Think before you **TREK** promotes the benefits of planning ahead for your bushwalking trip by using an easy to remember acronym:

- **T** - Take adequate supplies of food, water, navigation and first aid equipment.
- **R** - Register your planned route and tell friends and family when you expect to return.
- **E** - Emergency beacon (PLB's) are available free of charge from NSW Police Force and NPWS.
- **K** - Keep to your planned route and follow the map and walking trails.

29 April, From Hornsby Advocate: Police urge residents to check on welfare of neighbours after elderly woman found on floor of Turramurra unit

POLICE are urging residents to regularly check on the welfare of their elderly neighbours and family members after a woman in her 90s was found face down in the bedroom of her **Turramurra** unit yesterday afternoon. It is believed the woman had suffered a fall and had been lying there for a number of days. Fire & Rescue NSW officers were called in to gain access to the first-floor property after a local community services group reported not seeing the woman in several days. The woman was taken to Hornsby Hospital and treated for minor injuries.


“We would encourage relatives and friends of vulnerable and elderly people to keep an eye on them and make a phone call every couple of days or drop in and say hello,” Ku-ring-gai Local Area Command Senior Constable Paul Cleary said. “Police would also like to urge people to register vulnerable or elderly people with the **NSW Police Next of Kin program.**”

The register is a free service for older people who live alone to record their personal details at the local police station. It holds information about next of kin, doctors and dentists and any medical alerts. In an emergency, this information will help ambulance officers and police contact a relative or other named person.


29 April, Police have released CCTV images of a man they believe may be able to help with their inquiries into a reported act of indecency that occurred on a train in Sydney's south-west last year.

28 April, from the NRMA: Scam alert: fake infringement email targets drivers




Fake email.

SCAM EMAIL: If you receive an email like this, do not pay any money and do not click any attachments or links. You should delete the email straight away. Be wary of scam emails pretending to be infringement notices issued by a government authority such as the Australian Federal Police.

The “**Traffic Infringement Notice**” email and the website appear to be authentic, featuring convincing official design and branding and replicating official statements about the offence. The email includes a “see your traffic infringement” button, which links to a website where you are prompted to download a file containing details of a penalty notice. Do not download this file. It contains ransomware.

If you receive this email you should delete it. These messages are a scam and the ransomware could severely impact your system.



Fake website.

The scam emails and the website could easily be mistaken as authentic. Current examples circulating are generic and do not refer to the recipient’s name, address, vehicle or registered owner details. Please see these resources from the Australian Government on how to manage cyber crime:



From Hornsby Shire Council: Wildlife Protection Areas

Hornsby Shire Council has declared a number of **Wildlife Protection Areas** to help preserve our region's unique biodiversity.

How you can help

- Keep your dogs on a leash in Wildlife Protection Areas and stay on designated tracks. Council has a number of [leash-free areas](#) if you want to let your pet run free. Owners of dogs found roaming in Wildlife Protection Areas can be fined. [Read more about penalties.](#)
- Keep your cats contained on your property during the day and indoors at night. Cats found in a Wildlife Protection Area can be seized and the owner fined. [Read more about penalties.](#)
- All natural features including native vegetation, bush rock and fallen timber are protected and must not be removed or damaged.
- Dumping of rubbish or garden waste and the use of motor vehicles within these areas is prohibited.

3 HORNSBY A shopping trolley collector was arrested for drink-driving about 9.45pm Saturday. Police said the tractor driver was observed by members of the public having difficulty and getting frustrated trying to use the boom-gate ticket machine in the Westfield carpark. Police were called and the man recorded a positive breath test. A subsequent breath analysis returned a result of .244. A 34-year-old man has been charged with high-range drink-driving. He also had his licence suspended.
