30 September, Hornsby Police news, 30/9/13 The following relate to local issues in the Kuring gai Local Area Command:

Incident: Stolen car

Time/Date: between 6pm Sunday 29th and 8am Monday 30th

Place: Brookfield pl St Ives

Details: Unknown person/s have stolen a Nissan Navara from the driveway of a house, the Navara valued at \$22,000.

Incident: Stolen boat and trailer

Time/Date: Between 10.30pm Friday 27th and 6am Saturday 28th

Place: Norman Avenue, Thornleigh

Details: Unknown person/s have stolen a boat on a trailer from the yard of a home in Thornleigh. The boat was a White and Yellow Star brand, the trailer was home made.

Incident: Steal from motor vehicle

Time/Date: Between 10.50am and 11.50am on Sunday 29th

Place: Car park in Westfield Hornsby

Details: The owner had parked their car in the car park at Westfield Hornsby, the passenger window was left open. Unknown person/s have stolen a Samsung Galaxy S4 which was on the passenger seat.

Incident: Steal from motor vehicle

Time/Date: Between 12pm and 4pm Thursday 26th

Place: Stanhope rd, Killara

Details: Unknown person/s have used a rock to smash the window of a Subaru. An Ipad was stolen from the car and it was valued at an estimated \$500.

Incident: Steal from person

Time/Date: Between 2pm and 3pm Sunday 29th

Place: Woolworths shop in St Ives.

Details: The victim a 68 year old female was in the shopping centre. She has felt someone touching her handbag but thought nothing of it. About an hour later the victim discovered her wallet was missing. The wallet contained about \$520 and associated cards.

Incident: Break Enter & Steal

Time/Date: Between Thursday 26th and Sunday 29th

Place: Newhaven pl, St Ives.

Details: Several underground unit storage cages were broken into over the last few days. A car amplifier valued at \$2,000 and a push bike and tools stolen from another in the same complex. The bike was a Bronze coloured Ultegra brand custom made bike valued at an estimated \$5,000.

Incident: Break Enter & Steal

Time/Date: Between 2pm Wednesday 25th and 12.30pm Thursday 26th

Place: Killeaton st, St Ives.

Details: Unknown person/s have broken into the home, which was vacant at the time. About 10 windows were smashed, 7 walls were had graffiti painted on them and a TV was stolen. The total damage is not known at this point but is estimated to be several thousand dollars for repairs.

Incident: Break Enter & Steal

Time/Date: Between 10am Tuesday 24th and 6.30am Wednesday 25th

Place: Monmouth avenue, East Killara

Details: Unknown person/s have broken into the home by forcing open a ground floor laundry door. The home was vacant at the time, all the fly screens on windows were removed and thrown about. A flag pole was pulled out of the ground and a basket ball hoop was damaged. Damage is not known as the owner is on holidays.

Incident: Break Enter & Steal

Time/date: Between 8pm Tuesday 24th and 6am Wednesday 25th

Place: Railway Avenue, Wahroonga

Details: Unknown person/s have forced a lock open on a ground floor rear door to a business. Once inside the cash register was stolen. The register contained no cash but was valued at \$2,000.

Warning: To all who live in unit blocks. The storage cages and garage areas in these units blocks are being targeted by thieves. The storage cages which are in underground car parks are normally constructed of small section steel tubing with wire mesh either screwed on or welded to the frame. The door has small hinges and the securing mechanisms are simple sliding pad bolts. Padlocks are normally used to lock them. The security of these cages is quite simple and easily breached. That means forcing the locks or bending the frames is easy and anything inside is at risk of being stolen. Police have inspected several of these cages and they had very basic cheap padlocks to lock them. Sometimes these cages had thousands of dollars of property inside. Please have a review of the security of the cages and look to upgrade them. Have a qualified trades person inspect them and suggest how best to improve the security.

Of note, high-end push bikes some valued in the thousands have been stolen from cages like these in recent months. If you own a bike like this you are strongly encouraged to take it into the unit with you and secure it there. It is unknown how the bikes were targeted or if it was by chance.

Police are appealing to witnesses who may have information relating to the above incidents to contact **Hornsby police on 9476 9799, or phone Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000** to report any information relating to the matter anonymously.

29 September, from Berowra Waters Rural Fire Brigade: Yesterday at approx 2.26pm both Boat Alpha and Boat Charlie were responded to the **Barrenjoey Lighthouse Fire** with a combined crew of 11 volunteers between both vessels. This fire was very rapid in spread under the prevailing high winds. The waters boats together with 4 other boat brigades were tasked with the evacuation of bush walkers around the foreshore of the headland. The water conditions under the winds were extremely rough wished served to delay smaller vessels, Boat Alpha and Charlie were first on the scene. 27 September, TRAFFIC WARNING - NEXT WEEK: Minister for Transport Gladys Berejiklian has reminded Sydneysiders and visitors that trains and buses will be the best way to move around the city during the **International Fleet Review, next week from 3-11 October.**

The celebration, to be attended by Prince Harry, coincides with a number of major events including the NRL Grand Final and One Direction concert at Sydney Olympic Park. Many roads will be closed and extra clearways will be in place in Sydney's CBD and around the harbour for the Royal Australian Navy's International Fleet Review. Ferries are expected to be at capacity. "This is going to be the biggest celebration on Sydney Harbour in 100 years, and 1.7 million people are expected to participate," Ms Berejiklian said. "Throughout the nine days of celebrations in Sydney, extensive road closures and special event clearways will be in place in various locations at different times. "Getting around by car will be difficult, and anyone who has to drive in the city or around the harbour foreshore during this time should expect significant traffic delays." 25 September: Police have arrested two people over armed robberies at Roseville and Revesby earlier this week.

A 22-year-old man and a 20-year-old woman were arrested at a fast food restaurant at Kirrawee about 11pm (Tuesday 24 September 2013), by police from Sutherland Local Area Command. Police will allege during their arrest and transfer to Sutherland Police Station, the couple bit, kicked, punched and/or scratched seven police officers. A shortened shotgun, cash and clothing were allegedly found when police searched the couple's bags, and officers from the Metropolitan Armed Robbery Unit (MRU) – who are investigating this week's armed robberies at Roseville and Revesby – were alerted. The MRU last night took over the investigation into the alleged car-jacking of a man at Lane Cove, and the robberies of a Roseville cinema and a hotel at Revesby. Police yesterday appealed for public assistance to locate three men and a woman who they believed could assist with their investigations into the incidents. After last night's arrest, the couple were taken to Sutherland Police Station. The man has been charged with:

- Possess unauthorised prohibited firearm
- Possess ammunition without holding a licence
- Robbery while armed with a dangerous weapon x 2
- Damage property by fire
- Unlawfully take/drive motor vehicle
- Deal with identity information to commit indictable offence
- Assault police x 7

He will also face further charges following an incident at Dee Why on 19 September, 2013:

- Intimidate police officer in execution of duty
- Threaten injury to person with intent to prevent lawful detention
- Custody of a knife in a public place
- Assault police

The woman remains in police custody and is expected to be charged later today. Both are expected to be refused bail and will appear in Sutherland Local Court tomorrow. Police are still seeking to identify two other men believed involved in the incidents.

Sep 25: Thanks to Northern Beaches LAC

An elderly man was trapped in his car for 40 minutes after it left the road and crashed into a tree beside Mona Vale Rd on Sunday afternoon. Police said there may have been a minor collision between two cars travelling in the westbound lanes and that the man's car left the road and hit a tree about 400m east of St Ives Showground about 1.35pm. The driver suffered only minor injuries but was trapped by confinement until firefighters could cut him free, after which paramedics treated the man for minor injuries and took him to hospital for treatment. Westbound traffic on Mona Vale Rd was disrupted for more than an hour.

SECURE YOUR PUSHBIKES! The Northern Beaches Local Area Command has had a number of push bikes stolen recently from underground car parks of unit complexes. If you have a bicycle and you don't want it stolen take note of the following tips. If you are storing your bike in a unit block foyer/ garage/ balcony etc ensure that your bike is always locked with a secure locking device. Here are some security tips for bikes.

- * Use a heavy bike lock a 'D' style is definitely the best and a simple way to prevent theft
- * Lock your frame and the front wheel to something that won't move
- * If you have quick release wheels- use a second small cable lock to secure the other wheel to your frame

- * Secure your bike in an open place where there are lots of people and good surveillance rather than tucked away somewhere out of sight
 - * Always lock your bike up at home even if it is stored in the garage or garden shed
 - * Remove any valuable accessories from the bike when stored e.g lights, speedos etc
 - * Ensure that your bike is able to be identified and returned to you.
 - * Maybe paint the bike a bright colour such as orange or yellow
 - * Maybe put stickers on the bike and decorate to personalise it
 - * Record the serial number of the bike, make, model and store these details somewhere safe (serial number under the front chain rings)
 - * Take a photograph of the bike and store somewhere safe
 - * Engrave the bike with an identifiable number e.g drivers licence to ensure its safe return to you. (We have engravers at the station for loan)
 - * Mark the bike with an identifiable number using an ultra violet pen
- If you have lost a bike or had one stolen please contact police or bring in a photo to see if any of our bikes are yours.

"Man wanted over home invasion, assault - Cabramatta

Police in Sydney's south west are appealing for public assistance to locate a man wanted over an alleged home invasion and assault. A warrant has been issued for the arrest of **21-year-old Taylor Gambrell**. The warrant relates to the assault and stabbing of a teenage boy during a home invasion on Fairview Road, Cabramatta, in the early hours of Thursday 26th April 2012. Detectives from Cabramatta Local Area Command have been conducting extensive searches and are appealing for public assistance to locate Taylor Gambrell. He's described as being of Caucasian appearance, about 170cm to 180cm tall, thin build, with blonde hair and blue eyes. Detectives believe he may be travelling between south-western Sydney and the Central Coast. Members of the public who see Taylor Gambrell are urged not to approach him but to contact Triple Zero '000' immediately. Anyone with information should contact Cabramatta Police Station on 9725 8999 or Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000."

If your request is not urgent, you can contact us online, however please note, our staff can only respond during business hours (Monday to Friday, 8.30am - 5.30pm), which can lead to delays in attending to possible emergencies.

There is a bad odour near my residence. How do I report this?

To report a bad odour, the quickest way is to call us on 13 20 90 (24 hours a day, 7 days a week). We will investigate the source of the odour and either repair the fault, or report it to the appropriate authority for repair. If your request is not urgent, you can contact us online, however please note, our staff can only respond during business hours (Monday to Friday, 8.30am - 5.30pm), which can lead to delays in attending to possible emergencies.

How can I report graffiti on a Sydney Water property?

If you spot graffiti on one of our properties, please contact us to let us know. We need to know:

the street address and the nearest cross street

a description of the property that has been graffitied, for example whether it is a building, fence or pipeline

a description of the graffiti, including the approximate size and whether it is offensive.

A member of the Graffiti Removal Team may contact you to follow up on your report. For your own safety, if you do see graffiti on Sydney Water property, please do not attempt to remove it yourself. We have an experienced team who are familiar with our properties and can remove graffiti safely.

Have you seen 46-year-old Paul Rushworth?



Police from Redfern LAC - NSW Police Force are seeking help from the public to find a man missing since Friday, 13 September, 2013. Paul Rushworth, aged 46, from Redfern, was last seen about 7am on Friday 13 September, telling a friend he was leaving his Boronia Street address to go for a walk. About an hour later,

Mr Rushworth contacted a friend and said he was catching a train up to the Blue Mountains. He has not been seen since.

Detectives from Redfern are now investigating Mr Rushworth's disappearance and are keen to speak with anyone who may have information concerning his whereabouts. He is described as being Caucasian in appearance, about 170cm tall, with short brown hair. He was wearing blue jeans with brown walking shoes, red/maroon shirt, with a brown and cream coloured horizontal striped over shirt. Police have concerns for the welfare of Mr Rushworth as it is out of character for him to leave his home and not make contact with friends, and due to his mental state.

From Gordon Neighbourhood Watch Area 24/12: There has been some malicious damage around the **Marian Street Theatre** area recently.
