- **Media Release:** Our Crime Prevention Officer distributes this usually on a Monday morning. It covers incidents from the week before in our LAC.

6th February: About 1.45 am on **Sunday morning 2nd February 2013**, a young male from a Wyoming address has left a house party in **North Wahroonga**, he was walking towards the train station to go home. He had consumed an unknown amount of alcohol and was moderately intoxicated. During his travels he has inadvertently walked into the front yard of a North Wahroonga property. And fallen into a fish pond in the front yard. The resident has contacted police and requested that they attend. Upon attendance police have observed a young male who was wet from head to toe. He has apologised to the resident and was conveyed to Hornsby railway station to wait a train home.

5th February: NSW Police Dog Unit and Police Legacy have announced a unique fundraising campaign to name the newest litter of puppies born into the Force. Deputy Commissioner Catherine Burn joined Acting Dog Unit Commander, Acting Superintendent Adam Johnson, to unveil an online auction today (Monday 4 February 2013), where members of the public can bid for the right to name a puppy, with all proceeds going to NSW Police Legacy. The eight English Springer Spaniel pups, comprising four males and four females, were born to mum 'Maya' on Saturday 22 December 2012, and are the second litter of spaniels born into the unit's breeding program. In keeping with Dog Unit traditions of naming all litters alphabetically, the dogs will each be given a name starting with the letter 'B'.

One pup has been named '**Bryson**' in honour of the late Detective Inspector Bryson Anderson, who was tragically killed on duty on Thursday 6 December 2012, while attending an incident at Oakville.



Did you know?

Your **street number** should be prominently displayed at the front of your home. It should be large & clear enough to be seen from the street on a dark, wet night by police, fire brigade or ambulance workers in an emergency. Black numbers on a white background of about 30cmx30cm are recommended.

112 The emergency number worldwide for mobile phones is **112**. If you find yourself out of the coverage area of your mobile network and there is an emergency, dial **112** and the mobile will search any existing network to establish the emergency number for you, and interestingly this number **112** can be dialled even if the keypad is locked.

Locked out? Does your car have remote keyless entry? If you lock your keys in the car/boot and the spare key remote is at home, or with someone else, call them from your mobile phone. Hold the mobile close to the car door and have them press the unlock button, holding it near the

mobile phone on their end. Your car/boot will unlock. Saves someone from having to drive your key to you!

Incidents in the Kuring gai Local Area Command dated 11th February 2013:

Time/Date: Between 17:30 on Sunday 10th and 07:00 on Monday 11 February 2013

Location: Café/restaurant, Coonanbarra Road, Wahroonga

Incident: Break, enter and steal

Between 17:30 on Sunday 10th and 07:00 on Monday 11 February 2013 unknown person/s have gained entry to a café on Coonanbarra Road, Wahroonga by opening the rear closed but unlocked door. Once inside the premises the offenders have moved through the hallway, kitchen and office. A computer monitor attached to the security system was stolen from the office. The offender/s have rummaged through the filing cabinet in the office and have poured wine out on the kitchen floor and smashed a wine bottle.

Time/Date: About 3:05pm Friday 8th February 2013

Location: Dry Cleaners, Redleaf Avenue, Wahroonga

Incident: Stealing

About 3:05pm Friday 8th February 2013 a male has entered a dry cleaner business located Wahroonga. The male has seen the staff was preoccupied so he has leant over the service counter and managed to unlock the drawer to the cash register. He has walked behind the counter and removed cash from the cash register and quickly exited the store. The store staff were alerted, so they chased and challenged the alleged offender. A tussle has resulted with the male being held until police arrived.

Investigations are continuing.

Time/Date: 7.45am on Saturday 9th February 2013

Location: unit block in Bruce Avenue Killara

Incident: Persons trapped in lift

Around 7.45am on Saturday 9th February 2013 police attended a unit block in Bruce Avenue, Killara in response to a call for assistance from two persons trapped in a lift. Unsuccessful attempts were made to gain access to the elevator shaft as a result Fire and Rescue unit from Gordon removed the hinges from the ground level exterior fire access door. Police and Fire and Rescue entered the unit block via the fire exit and located the elevator stuck on level 3. Police were able to communicate with the two people trapped inside of the elevator to ensure that no one was hurt or required medical assistance.

Due to the level 3 elevator doors binding and being unable to be unlocked by fire & rescue, entry had to be gained into the elevator via the roof of the elevator car. Fire and rescue gained access to the top of the elevator via the elevator doors on level four. Fire and rescue gained entry via removing the maintenance hatch on the roof of the elevator car. The two trapped persons were safely evacuated via a ladder inserted in the elevator car via the maintenance hatch.

No persons were injured.

Time/Date: Between 07:30am and 4:30pm on Wednesday 06 February 2013

Location: Residence in Nadene Pl, Pymble

Incident: Break, enter and Steal

Between 07:30am and 4:30pm on Wednesday 06 February 2013 entry has been gained to a residence in Nadene Place, Pymble, via a ground floor rear sliding glass door. Offender/s have been into the numerous rooms with jewellery and a camera taken. Drawers and closed boxes were rummaged through.

Investigations are continuing.

Over the last weekend two schools in the Kuring Gai Command were the target of malicious damage resulting in damage totalling over \$700, the schools targeted were Waitara Public and Normanhurst Public Schools.
