12 September, NSW Police Force

Joint Counter Terrorism Team officers have charged a man with committing a terrorist act and attempted murder after another man was stabbed in Minto yesterday afternoon.

Emergency services were called to Ohlfsen Road, Minto, about 4pm (Saturday 10 September 2016), where it is alleged a 59-year-old man was stabbed a number of times while walking through a reserve.

He suffered serious injuries to his body and hands and remains in hospital in a critical condition.

When police from Macquarie Fields arrived at the scene, attempts were allegedly made to stab an officer through a window before a 22-year-old man was placed under arrest.

A large knife was seized for forensic examination and the man was taken to Macquarie Fields Police Station.

The Joint Counter Terrorism Team, comprising the NSW Police Force and the Australian Federal Police, has been investigating the incident together with Macquarie Fields Local Area Command.

The victim and the other man were not known to each other.

The 22-year-old man was this morning charged with Commit Terrorist Act (Section 101.1 – Criminal Code Act (Cth) 1995), and Attempted Murder (Section 27 – Crimes Act (NSW) 1900).

He was refused bail to appear at Parramatta Bail Court today (Sunday 11 September 2016).

Police would like to reassure the community there is no ongoing threat in relation to this incident.

The Safely Home Program is a joint Alzheimers Australia and NSW Police Force initiative.

When a person at risk of wandering is registered with Safely Home, they receive a stainless steel bracelet to wear at all times.

The bracelet features a toll free telephone number and personal identification number that is linked to the NSW Police Force Safely Home Database which is accessible 24/7.

If you find someone who appears to be lost and possibly has Dementia or Alzheimers, look at their wrist to see if they have a Safely Home Bracelet.

ESTABLISH AN ARRANGEMENT WITH NEIGHBOURS FOR WHEN ANY OF YOU ARE ON VACATION the local newspapers, putting out & retrieving garbage bins, clearing mailboxes, & watering, etc.

BE ON WITH NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH. They are your eyes and ears when you aren't. Your Crime Prevention Officer to find out about a group in your area. Maybe set up at street or building?

DOCK YOURSELF TO YOUR LOCAL POLICE STATION. Where should you go on is available there? When is it manned?

9 September, SCAM ALERT! Scammers claiming to represent Telstra are sending fake emails offering recipients refunds for double payment of a monthly bill.



The fake messages – headed Refund Bill Number: [a several digit number follows] ask the recipient to click on a link to make a claim for a refund of the overpayment.

They claim that the second payment will then be refunded to the recipient's bank account.

The message claims to be sent in the name of Gerd Schenkel, Executive Director, Telstra Digital Sales and Service.

Telstra advises customers that receive a phishing email or text message not to click on any links or attachments and to delete the message immediately.

6 September, Crime Stoppers NSW

Police have located a lost bushwalker after quick thinking police dispatchers got the lost woman to download the Emergency+ app on her smart phone.

About 6pm last night (Sunday 4 September 2016), police were called to the Mooray walking track at Heathcote following reports of a lost bushwalker.

Following the call, NSW police dispatchers contacted the lost 56-year-old woman and advised her to download the Emergency+ app on her smart phone in order to give emergency services her exact GPS co-ordinates.

After getting her location from the Emergency+ app, officers from the Sutherland Local Area Command and Miranda Local Area Command were able to establish a concise search area in order to find the woman from Erskineville.

The NSW Police Force, along with NSW Rural Fire Service and NSW Ambulance, then successfully located the woman safe and well.

Inspector Merrett of Miranda Local Area Command would like to thank the police search crews and members of the NSW Rural Fire Service and NSW Ambulance for their assistance with the search.

“Having the exact GPS co-ordinates from the Emergency+ app impacted our response time significantly. The app works in both urban and rural areas and we encourage everybody that owns a smart phone to download the app, particularly regular travellers and bushwalkers,” Inspector Merrett said.

The Emergency+ app uses GPS functionality built into smart phones to help a Triple Zero (000) caller to provide critical location details required to mobilise emergency services. The app is available to download on the App Store, Google Play Store and Windows Phone Store. In the event of an emergency you are able to use this app to call emergency services directly and give them your exact GPS co-ordinates for a quicker response time.

6 September, Number plate theft thwarted

Police are urging people to reduce the risk of their car numberplates being stolen by installing tamper free screws.

The Hills LAC is holding an Operation Tabella event on Thursday at Castle Hill between 10am and 2pm.

Crime Prevention Officer Snr Constable Christie Desira said numberplates were the most commonly stolen items and were often used to commit other crimes.

There were several incidents of numberplates being stolen in the Hills in the past few days including a theft in Jenner St, Baulkham Hills at the weekend and Salisbury Rd, Castle Hill overnight on Thursday.

A woman was spoken to by police in Pennant Hills Rd, Carlingford last week after they found the plates on her car did not belong to the vehicle.

Drivers can have irreversible numberplate screws installed free of charge on Thursday at Les Shore Place, Castle Hill next to Castle Hill Public school on Thursday between 10am and 2pm.

Police are being helped by The Men’s Shed members from Castle Hill who will be holding a barbecue. Members of Dural Men’s Shed and The Hills SES will help police install the one-way screws.

RFS UNITS SPREAD AWARENESS

SPRING may have only just sprung but bushfire season is fast approaching and the Rural Fire Service want us all to be part of Get Ready weekend on Saturday and Sunday.

NSW Rural Fire Service Hornsby Ku-ring-gai Superintendent Mark Sugden is calling all residents to join firefighters in preparing for the coming bush fire season.

The weekend will see volunteer firefighters holding events and activities all across the area.

"Regardless of the weather we have to endure over the coming season, now is the time to get ready," Supt Sugden said.

"NSW RFS members have been busy preparing for this season by undertaking hazard reduction burns, maintaining firefighting equipment and undergoing training.

"Get Ready Weekend is a chance for Hornsby Ku-ring-gai residents to also do their bit."

The activities for residents include displays, opportunities for children to climb aboard fire trucks and most importantly learn how to plan for a bushfire.

The top five tips for preparation are: trim overhanging trees and shrubs; mow your lawn and remove all the cuttings; remove material that can burn around your home; clear and remove all the debris and leaves from the gutters and prepare a hose or hoses that can reach all around the house.

BEROWRA HEIGHTS

1 A man, 41, was winched to safety from dense bushland in Berowra Valley National Park after rescue crews spent 24 hours looking for him following calls for help about 2.30am on Tuesday. Residents of Wyanna St alerted police after hearing calls for help but because of the dangerous terrain, a search was restricted to bush walking tracks until daylight. At about 8.20am a helicopter crew spotted the man, but because of the fog it took hours for an air ambulance to winch him out at 3pm. A command post was established in Berkeley Close while police, paramedics, a rescue helicopter and PolAir scoured the bush. The man's vehicle, where he was living, was found nearby with the keys in the ignition and music volume on very loud. He was taken to Hornsby Hospital for assessment.

HORNSBY

2 A man, 19, was charged with using his mobile phone to "upskirt" - film a teenage schoolgirl - at Hornsby railway station last week. Police Transport Command were approached by an 18-year-old girl at Hornsby railway station who alleged she had seen a man filming her about 4.30pm last Thursday. Police then detained and searched a man at the station, who had two mobile phones. spotted the man, but because of the fog it took hours for an air ambulance to winch him out at 3pm. A command post was established in Berkeley Close while police, paramedics, a rescue helicopter and PolAir scoured the bush. The man's vehicle, where he was living, was found nearby with the keys in the ignition and music volume on very loud. He was taken to Hornsby Hospital for assessment. Police allege one phone had inappropriate images of the teen. Officers also seized a laptop computer for forensic analysis. He was later charged with film person's private parts without consent and refused bail. Inquiries into the incident continue.

MOUNT KURING GAI

4 A 38-year-old man was injured in a work accident at Steggles Chicken about 12.30pm on Tuesday. The man was clearing processed chicken from a hopper when a hydraulic door closed and trapped his hand. It was opened by a fellow worker and he was taken to Hornsby hospital where he was treated for a fractured wrist. WorkCover may investigate.

6 A 2000 model silver Lexus sedan parked at a home on Galston Rd was stolen between 6pm and 11.15pm on Saturday.

OUR 20 FAVOURITE CRIME PREVENTION TIPS FOR SENIORS

TIP#5. NEVER ACCEPT DOOR-TO-DOOR OFFERS OF WORK FROM TRADESMEN (eg tree-logging, gutter maintenance) WITHOUT CONSULTATION WITH A TRUSTED FRIEND OR RELATIVE.

TIP#8. NEVER LET YOUR CREDIT CARD OUT OF YOUR SIGHT IN A CAFÉ OR RESTAURANT—GO WITH IT!

TIP#9. BUDDY-UP WITH A NEIGHBOUR— USE A SIGNAL TO SHOW YOU HAVE ARISEN SAFELY (eg a blind raised.)


