**27 January, Hornsby Police news, 27/1/15 The following relate to local issues in the Kuring gai Local Area Command:**

Incident:        [Traffic related incident](#)

Time/Date: About 3.30pm Monday 26th  
Place: Horace Street, St Ives.  
Vehicle 1: Ford  
Driver 1: 60 year old male  
Details: Police were patrolling the St Ives area and have seen the Ford which appeared to be travelling above the speed limit, a RADAR checked the speed at 78 in a 60 zone. The driver was stopped and spoken to about the matter. A license check revealed he was disqualified from holding a license until 2021. The male is to appear at North Sydney Local Court at a date yet to be set.

Incident: Middle range drink driving charge.  
Time/Date: About 10.30pm Monday 26th  
Place: M1 Motor way Wahroonga  
Vehicle 1: Mazda  
Driver 1: 35 year old male  
Details: Police were patrolling the M1 travelling in the 110 speed zone, at this point a Mazda has passed the police vehicle travelling at an estimated 130 in the 110 speed zone. Police have followed and finally stopped the Mazda. A 35 year old male was spoken to, a roadside breath test give an alleged positive result for alcohol. A further test gave a result of .115.

Court: The male is to appear at North Sydney Local Court at a date yet to be set charged with Speeding and middle range drink driving..

Incident: Car crash and middle range drink driving.  
Time/Date: About 8.40pm Monday 16th  
Place: Alma Street, Pymble.  
Vehicle 1: Hyundai  
Driver 1: 19 year old male  
Details: The 19 year old male who is a P2 license holder was travelling in Alma Street. The driver has rounded a bend in the road; the Hyundai has slid into the gutter before mounting the footpath and hitting a sand stone retaining wall. The driver was thrown from the car; it is believed he did not have the seat belt properly fitted. Some admissions were made in relation to drinking alcohol. 2 passengers in the car were treated by ambulance officers; the driver was taken to RNSH to treat minor injuries. Police will wait the results of blood tests prior to taking any action.

Incident: Car crash  
Time/Date: About 5.40am Tuesday 27th  
Place: Telegraph Road, Pymble.  
Vehicle 1: Corolla  
Driver 1: 51 year old male.  
Details: The Corolla has travelled along Telegraph Road, after the Corolla rounded a bend it has collided with a power pole. The driver was taken to RNSH with critical injuries and he remains in a coma.

Incident: Traffic charges  
Time/Date: About 9.30pm Monday 26th  
Place: Woodcourt Road, Berowra Heights.  
Vehicle: Commodore.  
Person: 20 year old male  
Details: Police were in Woodcourt Road and have seen and heard the Commodore spinning its wheels, losing traction for about 3 to 4 seconds. Police have turned around and stopped the Commodore. The driver was spoken to about the matter, at this point police noticed an almost empty bottle of alcohol on the passenger seat, with the driver allegedly smelling of alcohol. A roadside breath test gave an alleged positive result for alcohol. A further test gave a result of .142. The driver had his license suspended by police and he was charged.

Court: The driver is to appear at North Sydney Local Court at a date yet to be set.

Incident: Break, enter & steal.  
Time/Date: Between 12.30am and 7am Sunday 25th  
Place: Station Street, Thornleigh.  
Details: A garage to the family home was broken into via a side window. Numerous power tools were taken in the incident.


**27 January: Police have charged a man after he allegedly approached and intimidated two girls on a train near Hornsby last night.**

About 7pm (Monday 26 January 2015), two girls, aged 15 and 16, boarded a train at Central Railway Station heading to Wyong. A man boarded the train and entered the same carriage as the girls. He allegedly made inappropriate comments to the girls. The girls changed carriages and the man allegedly followed them, making further inappropriate comments. Other passengers then intervened. The girls got off the train at Berowra Railway Station. The man continued on the train and was met by officers from Brisbane Water Local Area Command at Woy Woy Railway Station. The 44-year-old was arrested and taken to Gosford Police Station. He was charged with two counts of intimidation, offensive behaviour and consume alcohol on a train. He was refused bail to appear at Gosford Local Court today (Tuesday 27 January 2015). The girls were collected by their parents and then attended a police station to speak to investigators.

**25 January, from Castlereagh command: A relevant warning for anyone, regardless of where you live.**

Residents - be wary of people trying to trick their way into your home.

About 12.45pm yesterday 21/1/15 a person has attended an address in Simpson Avenue Coonamble and asked the elderly occupant for a glass of water in an obvious attempt to be allowed inside, when entry was not gained the person has requested to use the toilet. Thankfully the occupant was suspicious enough not to allow entry.

This type of act is a common trick to gain entry to a residence and distract the occupant to allow the person to steal small items such as wallets, cash, jewellery, keys to allow entry later on or prescription medication as well as check out the layout and security measures of the home. The elderly are more likely to be targeted in this way.

Don't fall for the trick and do not allow entry into your home - get a good description of the person, try to take note of the direction they leave and call the Police.

**25 January: Police are appealing for public assistance to identify a man who died in August last year.**

About 7:35am on Thursday 28 August 2014, officers attached to Sydney City Local Area Command were called to the northern footpath on Refinery Drive, where they located the body of the man outside a building. While the man's death was not treated as suspicious, police have not been able to formally identify the man or locate any family or friends.

As police continue their inquiries into the identity of the man, who is only known as "Andy", they have released images of him, and his two distinctive tattoos. One of the tattoos, which was located on the man's left shoulder, is depicted in the images as a demon, with the words "Death to the world" and "Search and destroy" across it. The second tattoo contains the word "Hate", and was located across his fingers.

**25 January: A man is in custody this morning (Sunday 25 January 2015), following a police pursuit from Mooney Mooney to Hornsby.**

About 7.50am, Traffic & Highway Patrol officers were patrolling the M1 motorway as part of Operation Safe Return when they observed a white Toyota station wagon allegedly travelling at high speed towards Sydney.

Officers attempted to stop the vehicle and a pursuit was initiated. The vehicle allegedly reached speeds of 175km/h on signposted 110km/h roads. Police successfully deployed road spikes when the vehicle left the M1 at Wahroonga and the vehicle was stopped on Pennant Hills Road. A 20-year-old man was arrested at the scene and was taken to Hornsby Police Station. Investigations have established that the vehicle was stolen. The man is currently assisting police with inquiries.

### **22 January, from the Hornsby Advocate: Fake \$100 bills circulating in Hornsby district**

POLICE are warning local businesses to be on the lookout for counterfeit \$100 notes after a number have been circulated in the Hornsby district over the past few weeks. Ku-ring-gai Local Area Command crime prevention officer Paul Cleary said one was used to buy items at the Woolworths store in Thornleigh Marketplace last Thursday. "They (the counterfeit \$100 notes) are all over Sydney," he said. "There has been a number in this Local Area Command over the last couple of months." Fake \$100 notes have also been detected in the Hills district.


### **20 January, from our Crime Prevention Officer: Galston Gorge, yet again another truck got stuck earlier today.**

The driver of a rigid pantec truck at 11.2m in length seemed to think he could make the turns and hairpin bends. Despite protests from his passenger that the truck was over length and won't make it and the fact car drivers behind him were frantically flashing headlights and bipping him, the driver went for it and lost. The driver received for his troubles a fine of \$2142, six demerit points and had the

registration of the truck cancelled. Other road users and locals were again inconvenienced by a roag truck driver.

For the record, any rigid vehicle (car, truck, bus) legal length 7.5m, Any vehicle/trailer combination (car and trailer or truck and trailer) legal length 11.5m. There are signs and flashing lights at both ends of the gorge, there are markings in layby bays at both ends to measure for length. Perhaps the current systems in place are not good enough. Thoughts!



### **FEEDBACK FROM THE 'ALL AREAS' NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH (NHW) MEETING (Tuesday 20 January 2015)**

Dr Bruce McAdam, Roseville NHW Area Coordinator told how they were no longer supported by North Shore Local Area Command (LAC). Three other NHW groups in his command have folded, but Bruce's area is trying hard to survive. He is going to attend the NSW Police/Neighbourhood Watch Australasia Information Day on Thursday 19 February to see if he can find out more and get some assistance.

Neighbourhood Watch is no longer under the NSW Police umbrella and now comes under NHW Australasia (NHWA). S/C Paul Cleary (CPO) reported on a meeting with Supt Brad Shepherd where he confirmed that because NHW no longer comes under the NSW Police, we are no longer covered by their insurance policy. Any future events, NHW must get their own insurance or be organised by Kuring Gai LAC.

This leaves questions/confirmation hopefully to be answered at the Feb 19 Information Day, such as, can NHWA provide insurance? and will NHWA give direction?

**From Hornsby Shire Council, 22 January: Residents encouraged to report**

## illegal dumping

Hornsby Shire residents are being encouraged to stay vigilant about illegal dumping after a record amount of mulch was collected by Council. Hornsby Shire Council has noted a spike in the number of illegal dumping incidents, with 50 tonnes of dumped mulch being picked up in one day across the Shire last month.

Waste Services employee Dave Harding, who organised the mulch collection, said that the perpetrators are often companies who are paid by residents to remove trees then illegally dump the leftover material, costing money to ratepayers when it has to be removed. Hornsby Shire Council employs the use of CCTV monitoring in areas that are hotspots for illegal dumping, and has successfully used footage to prosecute perpetrators.

Dave said that he encourages members of the public to call the **Waste Hotline on 9847 4856** to report any incidence of dumping they witness, even if they are unsure if it is legal or not. Residents should try to write down the **number plate information of vehicles** they see dumping and should not approach the driver. “Often people will approach drivers they see illegally dumping, who then falsely claim they are from Council,” Dave said. “I would advise members of the public that if they see a truck dumping material that doesn’t have the Council logo on it, then it is not Council, and they should report the incident to us to be investigated.”



**From Careflight, 23 January: BOY, 6, CHECKED AFTER HOLIDAY PROGRAM HEAD KNOCK**

The CareFlight rapid response trauma team were called to a holiday program in Sydney's north today after a six-year-old boy gave carers a scare. The boy was playing in the Thornleigh Primary School grounds when he ran into a pole and knocked himself unconscious. Called just after 3pm, the CareFlight helicopter landed minutes later on the school oval by which time the boy had regained consciousness. Joined shortly afterwards by a NSW Ambulance crew, he received initial assessment and treatment from the CareFlight specialist doctor with the assistance of paramedics. With his parents also quickly on the scene, the youngster was taken by road ambulance to the Children's Hospital at Westmead for further treatment and tests.

**From the Hornsby Advocate, 22 January: DON'T DRINK AND DRIVE THIS AUSTRALIA DAY**

With The Australia Day long weekend now on the horizon, this is a timely reminder

to remember not to drink and drive. Police will be out conducting random breath tests night and day. When you consume a standard drink (a middy or small glass of wine) your blood alcohol rises on average 0.02. That standard drink, in general terms, takes one hour to metabolise out of your body. So if you have a big night out with a late finish, you are likely to be still over 0.05 for some time when you wake up. Always plan your night out “ and the next day as well “ to stay safe on the road.

**GALSTON** A truck driver was fined \$2142, lost six demerit points and had the registration of his vehicle cancelled after his truck got stuck in Galston Gorge about 11.25am on Tuesday. Police said the truck’s length was 11.2m, which exceeded the length restriction in the gorge of 7.5m.

**HORNSBY** A man was threatened with a knife during an attempted robbery in Linda St, Hornsby, on Monday night. Police said the man, 47, was walking home from Hornsby railway station about 6.30pm when two men walked in front of him yelling and making a disturbance. The man crossed the road to avoid the men but they approached him, showed a knife and demanded he drop his bag. The man then saw a car coming and waved it down for help. The offenders ran off in the direction of Muriel St. They were described as about 24 years old; one was of caucasian appearance and wore a black hoodie, the other was wearing a white hoodie with red trim. Police are reviewing CCTV footage from businesses.

**WAHROONGA** A computer hard disk, a video camera, surveillance equipment and a car key were stolen from a unit in Munderah St between 5pm Friday and 9am Monday. Police said the value of the property was about \$2450.

**THORNLEIGH** Copper piping was stolen from the external wall of a commercial unit complex in Sefton Rd, Thornleigh, between noon on Saturday and 8am on Monday.

**HORNSBY** A black Sony Xperia tablet valued at about \$700 was stolen from a display table at the JB Hi-Fi store at Westfield Hornsby on Sunday.

**From Ku-ring-gai Council, 20 January: Ku-ring-gai Council will construct a new road in Gordon shopping centre to boost pedestrian safety and access.**

The new road will be built between 41 Dumaresq Street and 36 McIntyre Street Gordon, providing improved vehicle access to the Pacific Highway and helping to divert local traffic away from the shopping centre. Funding for the new link road, expected to cost over \$800,000 in total, will be provided through developer contributions known as Section 94 levies. The new road will be completed later this year.
