09 February, from the Hornsby Advocate: Police want to speak to anyone who may have witnessed a single vehicle crash in West Pennant Hills on Friday afternoon. Initial investigations suggest a silver Mercedes was travelling west on Eaton Rd about 5pm when it left the road and crashed into a tree. The driver, a man aged in his 30s, was taken by CareFlight helicopter to Westmead Hospital with severe head injuries. Anyone with information is asked to call **Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000**.

09 February, from MyNRMA via Traffic & Highway Patrol command: What should you do if you see a child locked in a hot car?

On a typical Australian summer day, the temperature inside a parked car can be more than 30°C hotter than outside the car. That means that on a 30°C day, the temperature inside the car can reach over 60°C! A child left in a parked car under those conditions for even a few minutes can very quickly become distressed, dehydrated and can die from organ failure. If you see anything, you need to act quickly. If you wait, it can be too late.

09 February: A man is expected to appear in court after he was arrested and charged with allegedly impersonating a police officer at Homebush yesterday.

About 4.30pm (Saturday 7 February 2015), a 49-year-old woman was driving west along The Crescent, Homebush West, when she noticed a 2006 model white Subaru sedan travelling close behind her. The woman pulled over to allow the car to pass her; however, the other car also pulled over behind her. The male driver allegedly got out of his car and approached the woman asking her for her licence stating he was an undercover police officer.

07 February, from Crime Stoppers: Help Stop Business Break-Ins

- Display the street/shop number and business name at the front of the business to assist emergency services locate the property;
- Post warning signs around the business to warn intruders about the security features you have in place;
- Remove obstacles and rubbish from property boundaries, footpaths, driveways, car parks and buildings;
- Install security lighting around the perimeter of the business, particularly over entry/exit points;
- The doors, walls, floor and ceilings of the building should be of solid construction. Limit the number of entry/exit points to restrict unauthorised access;
- Doors should be fitted with quality single cylinder dead lock sets to comply with the Australian Building Code, fire regulations; Glass within doors and windows should be reinforced with either a shatter resistant film or laminated glass;
- Record descriptions, models/serial numbers of property owned by your business;
- If your business deals in cash then you should consider the installation of a safe to provide additional security. The safe should be manufactured and installed to the Australian and New Zealand Standards and should be anchored to restrict removal;
- Limit the amount of money you hold in the cash drawer. Don't count money in public view; Have a monitored intruder alarm system installed to enhance the physical security of your business;
- All ATMS should be placed away from entry points of your shop. They should be anchored to the ground and covered by way of CCTV.

07 February: Kuring-Gai LAC activities on Hawkesbury River with Launch Brooklyn

During a routine crime prevention and water safety patrol of the Hawkesbury River, on Saturday afternoon 7th Feb, patrolling officers using Police Launch Brooklyn became involved with local Marine Rescue NSW crews during the training exercise they were conducting on the river. of all and allows us to continue to provide a safer boating environment for the communities and other users of the River.

Around 11pm Wednesday 5th Feb Police from the Kuring-Gai LAC while patrolling the Pacific Highway stopped a vehicle in Warrawee and conducted a Random Breath Test of the driver. 05 February, from New England command: Make yourselves harder targets for thieves, protect your home and reduce your chance of becoming a victim of a break and enter.

1. Check and replace sensor lights, if necessary. If you do not have sensor lights,

make some enquiries about having some installed.

2. Check the front door locks. Don't forget to use them, whether you are home or out.
3. Check the window locks. Don't forget to use them, whether you are home or out. If you do not have window locks, make some enquiries about having some installed.
4. Check the garage and shed locks.
5. Repair gates and fences. Installing some simple gate locks can also improve the security of your home.

Now it's the time to sort out your security lighting and to make those improvements to the doors, windows and fences that have been put off during the year. Remember, there is no point installing great sensor lights, window or door locks if you do not use them. Forgetting to lock the front door or use the window locks just makes it easy for thieves to enter your home.

LOCK IT UP WHETHER YOU ARE HOME OR OUT AND ABOUT, REMOVE ANY OPPORTUNITY FOR THIEVES TO STEAL YOUR PROPERTY.



Remember to call **TRIPLE ZERO** for emergencies and crime happening now. If you see something suspicious call the local Police Station and report it.

From Eyewatch - Stonnington Police Service Area: Burglary is a problem in our area at the moment and Stonnington Crime Scene Services' Sergeant FINLAY has offered some tips that would pretty much have reduced the last 5 day's offences to nought:

- Point on entry " largely doors and unlocked in a majority of cases. Mostly back doors on yards where people think it's OK to have opened as it's onto a enclosed backyard.
- Burgs becoming TOMV " people leaving garages unlocked with keys in cars, or on a table just inside the house with unlocked house doors
- More likely to be burgled with laneways accessible " fence jumping, recommend fence extensions (add a few feet to high fences). If you have back gates etc ensure they are locked. Garage doors onto laneways should be locked.
- Alarms " if installed, turn them on and use them (eg/ zoning of house downstairs when upstairs, we've had numerous agg burgs where people are upstairs and downstairs is unarmed)
- CCTV " for homes, becoming more affordable and preference to have it installed in houses where possible " helping to identify offenders (not just for their house but others in the street). Lots of IP cameras are being used by people which previously were \$1000+ a camera, now as little as \$100 a camera. Can be linked to internet / router and people monitor the same from smart phones, tablets, etc.
- Apple products are still the flavour of a month " laptops, tablets, iphones. Many houses have been burged with non-apple computer items left behind and apple products are taken....'find my iphone' apps are easy to download and activate in the event of a theft.



From Hornsby Shire Council: Keep Hornsby Shire's drains clear and flood-free by following these tips when getting building material delivered.

- Avoid getting materials placed onto the nature strip, and if you have to, ensure they are at least one metre from the drain.
- You can also prevent drain blockage and ensure that your neighbours downstream don't have material flowing onto their property by using a sediment control fence, which are available from local hardware stores.
- Drainage easements are also an inappropriate place to dump excess building materials, mulch or grass clippings, as these can block drains and flood neighbours downstream.

KEEP YOUR CHILDREN SAFE ON THE INTERNET - Tips for children to stay safe on the internet:

- Do not send a picture of yourself to anyone you don't know and never place a full profile and picture anywhere on the internet
- Never give out your personal information, including name, home address, phone number or school
- Never arrange a face-to-face meeting with someone you have chatted with on the internet
- Tell your parents or another adult you know of any contact that makes you feel uncomfortable
- Remember that pressing "send" is definite and final "you can't get it back or take it down"

WAITARA A \$50 note believed to be counterfeit was detected by the manager of the McDonald's store at Waitara on Sunday night. Police have sent the note to the Australian Federal Police for verification.

THORNLEIGH Money from a petty cash tin and three mobile phones were stolen from a Pennant Hills Rd business, Sex Bomb Promotions, between 5pm Friday and 8am Monday. The thieves gained entry by cutting a hole in a door. They ransacked through drawers and filing cabinets in the main office.

WAHROONGA A bank card stolen from the letterbox of a Pacific Highway property was used to make two unauthorised transactions at a local service station. Police said the letterbox was tampered with between January 23 and 28 and the transactions, worth about \$100, were made on January 29. Police are reviewing CCTV footage. In a separate incident, a letterbox in Muriel St, Hornsby, was tampered with between 10am Saturday and 4pm Monday. Police said a parcel was opened and the contents removed.

HORNSBY Police want to speak to a woman following the theft of six cans of Jim Beam from the Dan Murphy's store at Westfield Hornsby on Sunday. She is described as caucasian appearance, wearing navy shorts and a blue Tshirt with the word "Australia" on it. In a separate incident, a bottle of whisky was stolen from the store on Monday.

WAHROONGA A 21-year-old woman was taken to hospital after an accident at the intersection of the Pacific Highway/Ingram Rd about 2.55pm on Monday. Police said a Toyota Dyna, driven by a 55-year-old male, was attempting to turn right from the Pacific Highway into Ingram Rd when it hit a Camry heading south on the Pacific Highway. The Dyna driver received a ticket for not giving way to oncoming

traffic.

BEROWRA WATERS Lights, a winch and winch post were stolen from a boat trailer parked at Berowra Waters Marina between noon Saturday and noon Sunday.

WARRAWEE A motorist was charged with highrange drink-driving and had his licence suspended after his vehicle was stopped on the Pacific Highway at Warrawee on Monday about 12.15am. Police allege the 28-year-old motorist did a U-turn and started travelling in the opposite direction after he saw the breath test station. He was stopped a short time later and allegedly tested positive when given a roadside breath test. A follow-up breath analysis returned a reading of 0.167.

WAHROONGA A bike and power tools worth \$ 1600 were stolen from the garage of a property in Woonona Ave between January 26 and 31. Police said the garage door was forced open. The bike is described as an 18- speed Giant model with a red frame and black seat.

PENNANT HILLS A 19-year-old man from Springfield was given a cannabis caution on Monday morning. At about 1am, the man was travelling north on Pennant Hills Rd when he was stopped for a random breath test. He returned a negative reading, however police had cause to search the vehicle after a conversation with the man. They found a small amount of cannabis in the driver's foot well.

2 WEST LINDFIELD A disqualified driver fled from police twice before being caught in East Lindfield on Tuesday. Police attempted to stop and then pursued a Mitsubishi Mirage heading north on the Eastern Distributor about 3.38am. The car was spotted by a police dog unit a short time later heading north on the Warringah Freeway. Another pursuit began when the car failed to stop and continued to Delhi Rd, North Ryde, where at speeds of 100km/h in a 60 zone, police terminated the pursuit due to public safety.

The car was then found parked on the footpath on Bradfield Rd, where two passengers were taken into custody and the driver fled. A police dog tracked the driver, 22, to bushland nearby and about 5.45am he was taken into custody. He was charged with driving while disqualified, driving dangerously and possessing suspected stolen goods.

The two passengers, one aged 16, were also charged with possessing suspected stolen goods.

1 ROSEVILLE A man, 35, was charged with low-range drink-driving after being stopped travelling north on the Pacific Highway about 12.57am on January 30.
