

Do not engage in any sales pitch which insists on paying in iTunes or gift cards.

The scammer will ask you to complete the sale by reading or sending the code to them or photographing the card's code for them, then promise to send the goods.

The NSW Police Force uses geo-targeting to help locate vulnerable missing persons, sending emergency alerts to mobiles in the area where the person went missing.


If you receive a text message from +61 444 444 444, it is an official alert to seek your assistance. It is NOT a scam - here's how you can check it's real:

- the message will always come from the same mobile number
- the message will always include a link to an image of the missing person

LIGHTS AND SIRENS BEHIND YOU? WHAT SHOULD YOU DO....

- 🚗 Do not panic
- 🚗 Slow down (but do not brake rapidly)
- 🚗 Use your indicators
- 🚗 Be aware of other motorists; drivers should not play music at such a volume they cannot hear outside noises
- 🚗 Do not move suddenly or move into the path of the emergency vehicle
- 🚗 Move as far to the left of the road as you can and come to a stop
- 🚗 If you cannot move out of the path safely, keep moving forward until it's safe to move over
- 🚗 Remember, you are required to abide by road rules at all times
- 👉 Always remember that seconds count in an emergency. If an emergency vehicle is approaching and is sounding an alarm or showing flashing lights, you must move to the left and out of the path of the vehicle as soon as you can do so safely

A man will face court today charged with murder following an investigation into the disappearance of a nine-year-old girl.

Strike Force Buena was established by Blue Mountains Police Area Command, assisted by the State Crime Command's Homicide Squad, to investigate the disappearance of a nine-year-old girl after she was reported missing from Mt Wilson on Friday (14 January 2022).

Following extensive investigations, officers attached to the strike force yesterday (Tuesday 18 January 2022), conducted a search in the vicinity of the Colo River.

With the assistance of the Police Divers, Hawkesbury Police Area Command, Public Order and Riot Squad (PORS), Operational Support Group (OSG) and Police Rescue Squad, the body of a child was located in a barrel. The body is yet to be formally identified.

A crime scene was established and is being examined by specialist forensic officers.

As part of ongoing investigations, detectives attached to Strike Force Buena attended a unit in Riley Street, Surry Hills about 8.30pm last night (Tuesday 18 January 2022), and arrested a 31-year-old man.

He was taken to Surry Hills Police Station and charged with murder.

The man was refused bail to appear in Central Local Court today (Wednesday 19 January 2022).

Investigations under Strike Force Buena are continuing.

A safe journey on your motorcycle starts with making sure you are wearing the right protective gear.

To improve your safety on a motorcycle, follow some of these points that can be found at www.ridetolive.nsw.gov.au

Aim for the best possible protection, with riding gear that:

- Covers your whole body, preferably with abrasion resistant material in vulnerable areas.
 - Has impact protectors over the joints.
 - Has seams with more than one line of stitching, and at least one line of concealed stitching on exposed seams.
 - Secures and protects all fasteners from contact with the road in a crash.
 - Avoids external pockets or straps that could be potential tear points or become snagged in a crash.
 - Uses insulated, windproof and waterproof materials to protect from the cold.
 - Uses reflective or light colours and ventilation to protect from the heat.
 - Fits properly so it will remain in place in a crash.

Police warning as thieves target car exhausts worth more than gold
Modern motor vehicles have exhaust systems with precious metals worth more than gold. Now thieves are targeting parked cars, leaving motorists stranded and with big insurance bills.

Police across Australia have issued warnings over an increase in the theft of car exhaust systems that contain precious metals worth more than gold.

Criminals are targeting vehicles parked in driveways, commuter car parks, and dealer lots.

A recent spate of thefts in shopping centre car parks have prompted authorities to alert the community about suspicious activity, and make a public plea for more information.



21 January, from Crime Stoppers NSW: Dealing with barking dogs...



If you're concerned about the excessive barking of a dog, you can find information on the potential causes, and advice on how to deal with the problem at the Environmental Protection Authority (EPA) website.

If the noise is coming from your neighbour's dog, try talking to your neighbour as they might not know their dog is bothering you.

If the problem persists, there are a few ways to resolve the issue:

🐾 Contact the Community Justice Centre (CJC) to help mediate and settle the problem

🐾 Contact your local council who may issue a nuisance order (which incurs a fine for non-compliance) to the dog's owner, or

🐾 Seek a noise abatement order from your local court.

From NHW in Ku-ring-gai & Hornsby: 'Our 20 Favourite Crime Prevention Tips for Personal Safety'

- **Tip #4.** WHEN TRAVELING ON A TRAIN, SIT NEAR THE GUARD'S COMPARTMENT. Try not to fall asleep. When traveling on a bus, sit near the driver. When taking a taxi, before getting in, verify the authority card photo matches the driver.
- **Tip #5.** IF YOU FEEL UNCOMFORTABLE WITH A FELLOW PASSENGER ON A TRAIN, IMMEDIATELY LEAVE THE COMPARTMENT. Select a different compartment.

- **Tip #10.** NEVER LEAVE KEYS IN A HIDING SPOT OUTSIDE THE HOME. Instead leave spare keys with a trusted friend. Consider Fingerprint, Key Pad or Bio Locks.
- **Tip #14.** WALK IN WELL-LIT REGULARLY TRAVELED WALKS AND PATHWAYS AREAS. [Report a street light fault—Ausgrid 1800 044 808.] If followed, cross the street, crossing back and forth if necessary. If pursued, DO ANYTHING to attract attention—scream, pull a fire alarm, flag down a passing motorist, etc. Carry a personal alarm. Stay calm and in control.
